Suffolk County Council (Parish of Long Melford) B1064 Barley Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1986

Notice is hereby given that on 14th October 1986 Suffolk County Council made the above Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is to prohibit waiting at all times in the B1064 Barley Road for 150 metres west of its junction with the A134 Sudbury Road.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any of the requirements of that Act or any Instrument made under it have not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The notice of Intention relating to this Order appeared in the *London Gazette* on 28th May 1986. The effect of the Order as made is as in that notice.

SOUTHWARK LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Southwark (Prescribed Routes) (No. LBS2) (Traffic Order 1986

Made-8th October 1986

coming into operation 22nd October 1986

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Southwark on 1st October 1986 made the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (1984 c.27) as amended by Schedule V, part 1, paragraph 4 (3) (a), of the Local Government Act 1985 (1985 c.51).

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit unauthorised vehicular traffic in:

Gaza Street, except for a length of 7 metres (7.63 yards) from its junction with the back edge of the southern footway of Braganza Street.
