TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 5th December 1986, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877 and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, 8th December 1986 to Friday, 12th December 1986, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Notification will be sent on the day of the Tender to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of an accepted Tender must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash, banker's draft payable through the Town Clearing or by cheque drawn on the Bank of England, not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated and on which they are to be collected from the Securities Office.

6. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

7. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right to reject any Tenders.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL REGULATIONS 1976

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order entitled "The Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (County of Avon) (No. SW2) Order 1986". The Order comes into operation on 3rd December 1986 and extinguishes any right which persons may have to use vehicles (other than those specified in Schedule 2 to the Order) on lengths of Cheapside Street, Oxford Street and Bushy Park, Totterdown.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, by applying to the offices of the Director (Transport), Department of Transport, South West Region, Room 402, Tollgate House, Houlton Street, Bristol BS2 9DJ (quoting Ref. No. DSW 504135/1/221 and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Avon County Council, Floor 6, Avon House, The Haymarket, Bristol BS99 7DE.

If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity, or the validity of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, within 6 weeks from 3rd December 1986 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained in it.
