Hanover, December 6. N. S.

ON Saturday last the Court return'd from Gohre to this Place, where they intend to pass the rest of the Winter. The Elector and Electress Dowager have sent two Gentlemen of their Household, to compliment the Duke of Wolfenbuttle upon the Marriage of his Granddaughter with the Prince of Bevern. It was reported here for some time, that a Peace was concluded between Sweden, and the Princes in Alliance against it; but this Day Advice is arriv'd, that they have only agreed to a Suspension of Arms. The Czar stay'd three or four Days at Berlin in his way from Carlsbad, and on the 1st Instant he went towards his Army in Mecklenburg. We are assur'd that he hath refus'd to give his Consent to any Truce agreed on by his Ministers.

Hamburg, Decemb. 9. N. S. We have received Advice, that the Czar hath altered his Resolution of going to Altona, and that he hath sent notice of it to the King of Denmark, who expected to see him there. He hath expressed great dissatisfaction at the Cessation of Arms agreed on between the Counts Steinbock and Flemming, and declares that he never gave Prince Menzikow a Power to consent to it in his Name. His Prussian Majesty hath nominated the Prince of Anhalt Dessau Field-Marshal, but he is to have no Salary annex'd to his Command, during the Life of the Count of Warthenleben. This Honour is said to have been conferr'd upon him as a Reward for his Conduct, in seizing the Castle of Meurs. The King of Denmark hath agreed to let Vice Admiral Seesledz continue all this Winter on the Coasts of Pomerania, upon Condition that King Augustus shall contribute Eight thousand Crowns a-month, towards the Maintenance of that Squadron. The 15th there is to be a Congress at Brunswick, between the Ministers of the King of Prussia, the Elector of Hanover, the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel, and the Duke of Wirtemberg, to deliberate about the Means of establishing Repose in the Circle of Lower Saxony, and upon other important Affairs.

Utrecht, Decemb. 13. N. S. On the 10th Instant, the Hereditary Prince of Hesse Cassel set out from hence on his way home. Monsieur Renwood and Monsieur Gollinga, two of the Plenipotentiaries of the States General, are returned here from the Hague, where they have been for some Days, since the Earl of Strafford's arrival at that Place. His Excellency is expected here to Morrow Night, and it is thought Measures will then be taken for renewing the General Conferences between the Ministers of the Allies, and those of France. The former met Yesterday, as usual, in the Town-house.

Paris, Decemb. 15. N. S. The Duke d'Aumont hath taken leave of the Court, and intends to set

out from hence in two Days for Great Britain. On the 10th Colonel Pearson arrived here in his way from Madrid, with two Exemplifications of the King of Spain's Renunciation to the Crown of France: One of which is to be delivered to Her Majesty at London, and the other to Her British Plenipotentiaries at Utrecht.
