Declaring the Continuation of the Ceffation of Arms, as well by Sea as Land, agreed on between Her Majefty and the Moft Christian King, and enjoining the Obsetvance thereof.

ANNE K. WHEreas for putting an End to this long and expensive War, and for restoring a General Peace, a Treaty has for some time been fet on Foot, and is now carrying on at Utrecht; and whereas for preventing the Effusion of Christian Blood, and all the Events of War which might pos-fibly intercept the Progress of that Negotiation, and for the better Securing the Trade of Our Kingdoms, and the Dominious thermut helonging. It was and the Dominions thereanto belonging, It was agreed between Us and Hu Most Christian Majesty, That there should be a General Cessuiton of Warlike Altions and Enterprizes, and of all Alts of Hostility in general, between the Armies, Troops, Fleets, Squadrous, and Ships of Us and the Melt Christian King, during the Term of Four Mon hs, to Commence King, during the Term of Four Mon hs, to Commence from the Eleventh Day of Augult last past, and to continue until the Eleventh Day of this Instant Det comber, whereof We were pleased to give Notice by Our Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Eighteenth Day of August last. And whereas We and the Most Christian King, for the Reasons aforefaid, have agreed, That the said Cessation of Arms, as well by Sea as Land, shall be prolonged and tontinued for the Term of Four Kalendar Months longer, to Com-mence from the faid Eleventh Day of December. mence from the faid Eleventh Day of December, and to continue till the Eleventh Day of April, which will be in the Tear of Our Lord Olte thousand feven bundred and thirteen. We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Countril, to Notifie the fume to all Our Loving Subjects; and We do Declare, That Our Royal Will and Pleasure is, and We do bereby firstly Charge and Command all Our Officers both at Sea and Land, and all other Our Subjetts what see and Land, and sub other Our Subjetts what see or to forbear all Alt's of Ho-fility, either by See or Land, against His Most Christian Majesty, bu Vallats or Subjetts, during the faid Space of Four Months, under the Penalty of incurring our High Displeasure,
