**O**n Sunday in the Evening, the Conde de Molina Ambassador Extraordinary from His Catholick Majesty had his Audience from their Majesties.

On Monday morning early His Majesty and His Royal Highness went hence to Newmarket, to divert themselves for some time in the Recreations of that place; and the same day, her Royal Highness set forwards towards Audley-End; whither Her Majesty removed the next day.

On Monday last Captain Pierce, late Captain of His Majesties ship the *Saphire*, together with the Lieutenant, were according to the Sentence of the Court Marshal, executed on board the *Dragon* near Deptford.

Vienna, Sept. 20. It has been lately resolved at a Council of War, that Orders shall be sent into Hungary, for the demolishing of all the smaller and more inconsiderable Forts in Hungary, and that the German forces there in Garrison, shall be sent for the reinforcement of such places as are of greater concernment. The Emperor has thought fit also to send more Infantry into Hungary, that so, besides the Garrisons there, a Body of 10000. men may be in readines to march upon any occasion.

The Emperors standing Army is to be augmented to the Number of 40000. men, to which end the Count de Montecuculi presses for the speedy raising of four new Regiments of foot, and two of Horse.

This Court is much surpris'd with the news of the invasion of Lorraine by the French, but the Chevalier de Gramonville the French Resident, has endeavoured to satisfy the Court with the reasons which moved the King his Master to it, His Majesty having written large Letters hither upon this Subject, offering the Duchy to the Prince of Lorraine, Nephew to the now disposessed Duke.

The 15th instant arrived here General Spork from the Upper Hungary, and on the 17th gave his Imperial Majesty a large account of his whole expedition, and has so fully satisfied him with his good Conduct, that the Emperor, as a particular mark of his favour, was pleased to bestow on him his picture richly set with Diamonds. The General has left his forces in their Quarters near *Franzschin*, but the Train of Artillery is this day arrived here.

The Count Michael Esterhazy is fled for safety amongst the Turks, where tis not probable he can long enjoy it, since the Bassa of *Buda* has sent to assure the Emperor that he has Orders from the Grand Segnior to put irons upon any of the Rebels that shall retire into any part under his Government, and to send them to the Emperor.

Orders are given out for forming a Procès against the Count *Serini* and the Marquis de *Franzignani*, for which several Judges are nominated.

and the Chancellor of the Chamber to be their President, but tis believed they will not proceed capitally against them, but only to confiscation and perpetual imprisonment.

The Comte de *Souches* at present Governor of this place, is to go for Hungary to Command there as Lieutenant-General of that kingdom.

The Count *Nadassi* appears so Criminal in contriving and carrying on the late rebellion; that his Children and Relations find no encouragement to use their endeavors as they at first intended for his justification, but having throwt themselves at the Emperors feet, his Imperial Majesty has been graciously pleased to allow them a liberal maintenance out of the Counts Estate for their support and maintenance.

On Monday last the Empress Dowager sent away an Expres for Poland, with several Standards richly embroidered with the Arms of Poland, to be presented to his Majesty upon the day of the Queen her daughters Coronation.

Venice, Sept. 20. Our last Letters from Constantinople advise us, that our Bayly the Chevalier *Molino* is there treated with extraordinary kindness and magnificence by the particular recommendation of the Visier, who continues at the Court with the Grand Segnior at *Adrianople*, assisting him with his Counsels.

The Court has not yet resolved when to return to Constantinople, being not fully informed of the bottom of the designs of the Sultaneis. The Visier is endeavouring to bring things to a moderation, and to gain time, perswades the Grand Segnior to use the methods of sweetness and gentleness, which may happily frustrate the designs of such as privately endeavor at a fresh disturbance in the Empire; to which advice the Grand Segnors Genius also inclines him who spends the greatest part of his time in hunting.

The Plague rages much in the Visiers Army, which is Quartered, part of it near *Adrianople*, and the rest in *Morea*, by which means the infection is much spread abroad in the neighbouring Towns and Villages; nor is the kingdom of *Candia* and the adjacent Islands free from the same infection, which puts a present stop to all Trade and Commerce.

General *Barbaro* has dispatched hither several persons to make provision of rich Livettes for his Train, and great quantity of all sorts of Conferures and other things that may be convenient for the entertainment of the Bassa of *Bosnina*, who is to meet him upon the borders for the adjoining of all differences about the bounds, to take away all occasion, if possible, of any future quarrel.

Two Troops of Horse are ready to be embarked for his said Excellents service, with whom are also to go Cavalier *Grimaldi* and Colonel *Rhadso*.

The Duke de *Nevers* with his Dutchess, are lately arrived here from *Padua*, and are taking houses, intending to continue here all this winter.

The Prince Elector of *Bologne* has spent some time in this City to take a view of its Curiosities; on Sunday last he was regalled in the name of the publick, but not with all the Ceremonies due to a person of his high Quality, he being not pleased to appear
