Molina Ambasiador Extraordinary from His Catholick Majesty had his Audience from their Majesties.

On Munday morning early His Majefty and His Royal Highness went hence to Newmarket, to divert themselves for some time in the Recreations of that place; and the same day, her Royal Highness set forwards towards Audley-End; whither Her Majesty removed the next day.

Vienna, Sept. 20. It has been lately refolved at a Council of War, that Orders shall be sent into Hungary, for the demolishing of all the smaller and more inconsiderable Forts in Hungary, and that the German forces there in Garrison, shall be sent for the reinforcement of such places as are of greater concernment. The Emperor has thought fit also to fend more Infantry into Hungary, that so, besides the Garrison there, a Body of 10000. men may be in readiness to march upon any occasion.

The Emperors standing Army is to be augmented to the Number of 40000. men, to which end the Count de Montecuculi presses for the speedy raising of sour new Regiments of soot, and two of Horse.

This Court is much furprifed with the news of the invation of Lorrain by the French, but the Chevalier de Gromonville the French Refident, has endeavoured to fatisfy the Court with the reafons which moved the King his Master to it, His Majesty having written large Letters hither upon this Subject, offring the Dutchy to the Prince of Lorrain, Nephew to the now disposefied Duke.

Lorrain, Nephew to the now disposefied Duke. The 15th instant arrived here General Spork from the Npper Hungary, and on the 17th gave his Imperial Majesty a large account of his whole expedition, and has so fully fatisfyed him with his good Conduct, that the Emperor, as a particular mark of his favour, was pleased to bestow on him his picture richly set with Diamonds. The General has left his forces in their Quarters near Franschin, but the Train of Artillery is this day arrived here.

The Count Michael Efferhaft is fied for lafety among A the Turks, where tis not probable he can long enjoy it, fince the Baffa of Buda has fent to affure the Emperor that he has Orders from the Grand Segnior to put irons upon any of the Rebets that shall retire into any part under his Goyernment, and to fend them to the Emperor.

Orders are given out for forming a Process against the Count Seriei and the Marquis de Frangipani, for which several Judges are nominated. and the Chancellor of the Chamber to be their Prefident, but tis believed they will not proceed capitally against them, but only to confiscation and perpetual imprisonment.

The Comte de Souches at present Governor of this place, is to go for Hungary to Command there as Lieutenant-General of that kingdom.

The Count Nadafi appears fo Criminal in contriving and carrying on the late rebellion; that his Children and Relations find no encouragement to use their endeavors as they at first intended for his justification, but having throws themfelves at the Emperors set, his Imperial Majesty has been graciously pleased to allow them a liberal maintenance out of the Counts Estate for their support and maintenance.

On Monday laft the Empress Dowager sent away an Express for *Poland*, with several Standards richly embroidered with the Arms of *Poland*, to be presented to his Majesty upon the day of the Queen her daughters Coronation.

Venice, Sept. 20. Our last Letters from Constantinople advise us, that our Bayly the Chevalier Molino is there treated with extraordinary kindness and magnificence by the particular recommendation of the Visier, who continues at the Court with the Grand Segnior at Adrianople, affisting him with his Counsels.

The Court has not yet refolved when to return to Conftantinople, being not fully informed of the bottom of the defignes of the Sultanefs. The Vifier is endeavouring to bring things to a moderation, and to gain timesperfwades the Grand Segnior to dife the methods of fweetnefs and gentlenefs, which may hap pily fruftrate the defignes of fuch as privately endeavor at a frech diffurbance in the Empire; to which advice the Grand Segniors Genius also inclines him who spends the greatest part of his time in hunting.

The Plague rages nuch in the Visiers Army, which is Quartered, part of it neer Adrianople, and the reft in Morea, by which means the infection is much spread abroad in the neighbouring Towns and Villages; nor is the kingdom of Candia and the adjacent Islands free from the same infection, which puts a present ftop to all Trade and Commerce.

General Barbars has difpatched hither feveral perfons to make provision of rich Livetles for his Train, and great quantity of all forts of Confetures and other things that may be convenient for the entertainment of the Balla of Bofsina, who is to meet him upon the borders for the adjoufting of all differences about the bounds, to take away all occasion, if possible, of any future quarrel.

Two Troops of Horfe are ready to be embarked for his faid Excellencie fervice, with whom are alfo to go Cavalier Grimaldi and Colonel Rhados.
