THIS Evening the Baron de Grote, Envoy Extraordinary from the Eleſtor of Hanover, had his firſt private Audience of Her Maſteſty, being introduced by the Rt. Hon. the Lord Viſcount Bolingbroke, One of Her Maſteſty's Principal Secretaries of Stats, and Conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Maſter of the Ceremonies,

Conſtantinople, November 5. Some Days ago Achmet Aga returned from Poland, where he had been ſent with a Commiſſion to examin how far the Muſcovites had perform'd the Articles of their late Treaty with the Grand Signior. He hath made a Report, that the Czar's Troops were ſtill in Garriſon in ſeveral Places of that Kingdom; and Reſentments to the ſame effect are ſince come from other Hands. On this Occaſion the Sultan hath expreſſed great Reſentment, and in a Council held at the Seraglio, the laſt of October, it was reſolved to declare War againſt the Czar, for not having fulfilled his Engagements. The ſame Evening the Muſcovite Ambaſſadors were ſent Priſoners to the Seven Towers. And the next Day the Vizir Azem was depoſed, and baniſh'd to Mitylene. General Goltz, Envoy Extraordinary from King Auguſtus, is ſent to Adrianople, and Orders are given to ſecure the Palaſin of Mazovia at the ſame Place. The Port is now employ'd in preparing Inſtructions for the Tartar Han, and ſending Supplies of Money to him and the King of Sweden.

Lisbon, December 24. N. S. On the fifth Inſtant arrived here a Courier, who brought a Treaty for a Suspension of Arms between the Crowns of Portugal, France and Spain. The Marquis de Bay hath taken Poſſeſſion of Valencia d'Alcantara, a ſtrong Town on the River Savar, and of ſome Villages near it. This hath occaſion'd ſome Diſpute between this Court and the Marquis, notwithſtanding which the Truce hath been proclaim'd here, and it is thought the Differences which have riſen upon that account will be amicably adjusted. A ſolemn Proceſſion and great Devotions have been lately made here, for obtaining long Life and Proſperity to the young Prince of Brazil. On the Twenty firſt Sir Nicholas Trevanian, with the Squadron under his Command, arrived in this Harbour from Newfoundland, and Yeſterday came in Her Maſteſty's Ship the Greenwich, the Lord Forbes Commander. As ſhe was coming up the River ſhe was carried a-ſhore by the Violence of the Freshes, but great Diligence being immediately uſed to get her off again, ſhe ſeems now to be out of all Danger.

Hamburg, Decemb. 30. N. S. Yeſterday the King of Denmark left Oldesloe, and went in great haſte towards Jutland. Lieutenant General Dewitz, who was reported to have been killed in the late Battle near Gadebuſch, is found to be alive, and continues encamped at Ratzebourg with the Daniſh Army, conſiſting of thirty Squadrons, which it is ſaid are to join the Muſcovites, in order to try a ſecond Engagement with Count Steinbock. The Czar is ſtill at Swerin, and his Army is advanced to Stenberg, where they are ordered to halt till the arrival of the Danes and Saxons. On the 24th King Auguſtus paſſ'd through Lanſberg on his way to Warſaw. Two Swediſh Regiments under the

Command of Major General Schommer have paſſed the Trave, and ſent to deſire Paſſage through the City of Lubec, but the Senate excus'd themſelves from granting it, becauſe they have reſolved to obſerve an exact Neutrality. Major General Morner, a Daniſh Priſoner, is come hither upon his Parole, and ſeems extremely pleaſed with the Treatment he received from Count Steinbock.

Utrecht Jan. 3. N. S. On the one and thirtieth paſt, the Miniſters of the States General who went lately to the Hague returned hither, and ſoon after their arrival, they deſired a Conference with the Britiſh Plenipotentiaries, in which they acquainted their Lordſhips, that the States their Maſters, were come to an unanimous Reſolution to concur with Her Maſteſty's Meaſures for procuring a General Peace, and at the ſame time aſſured them of the deep Senſe their High Mightineſſes have of the repeated Inſtances of Friendſhip Her Maſteſty hath ſheyn for their Republick during this whole Tranſaction. On Sunday and this Morning, the ſaid Miniſters were again in Conference with their Lordſhips, who have likewiſe had frequent Conferences of late with the Plenipotentiaries of France, Savoy, and the aſſociated Circles of Germany. Yeſterday Morning thoſe of the Allies met in the Town-houſe, as uſual. Count Sinzendorf is returned hither from the Hague. Monſieur Mellarede, one of the Duke of Savoy's Miniſters, is alſo come from the ſame Place, where he ſtay'd a Day or two on his way from England.

Dover, Decemb. 27. Yeſterday his Grace the Duke of Shrewsbury embark'd on board the William and Mary Yacht, and at Seven a-Clock in the Evening ſet Sail with a fair Wind for Calais, where it is hoped he is now arrived, the Wind having continued favourable ever ſince.

Whitehall, December 29. Her Maſteſty hath been graciouſly pleaſed to confer the Honour of Knight-hood upon William Lewen, Eſq; Alderman, and one of the preſent Sheriffs of the City of London.
