HIS Evening the Baron de Grote, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Hanover, had his first private Audience of Her Ma-Jefty, being introduced by the Rt. Hon. the Lord Viccount Bolingbroke, One of Her Majefty's Prin-cipal Secretaries of State, and Conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Master of the Ceremonies,

Conflantinople, November 5. Some Days ago Achmet Aga returned from Poland, where he had been font with a Commission to examin how far the Muscovites had perform'd the Articles of their late Treaty with the Grand Signior. He hath made a Report, that the Czar's Troops were still in Garrifon in feveral Places of that Kingdom; and Reprefentations to the fame effect are fince come from other Hands. On this Occasion the Sultan hath expressed great Refertment, and in a Council held at the Seraglio, the last of October, it was resolved to declare War against the Czar, for not having fulfilled his Engagements. The fame Evening the Mufcovite Ambaffadors were fent Prifoners to the Seven Towers. And the next Day the Vizir Azem was depofed, and hanifh'd to Mitylene. General Goltz, Envoy Extraordinary from King Augustus, is sent to Adrianople, and Orders are given to fecure the Palatin of Mazovia at the fame Place. The Port is now employ'd in preparing Instructions for the Tartar Han, and fending Supplies of Money to him and the King of Sweden.

Lisbon, December 24. N. S. On the fifth Inftant arrived here a Courier, who brought a Treaty for a Sufpension of Arms between the Crowns of Por-Supeniton of Arms between the Crowns of For-tugal, France and Spain, The Marquis de Bay hath taken Possetion of Valentia d'Alcantara, a ftrong Toyyn on the River Savar, and of fome Vil-lages near it. This hath occasion'd fome Dispute between this Court and the Marquis, notwith-ftanding which the Truce hath been proclaim'd here, and it is thought the Differences which have visco upon that account will be amicably addingted rifen upon that account will be amicably adjusted.

Command of Major General Schoinmer have paffed. the Trave, and fent to defire Paffage through the City of Lubec, but the Senate excus'd themfelves from granting it, because they have resolved to observe an exact Neutrality. Major General Morner, a Danish Prisoner, is come hither upon his Parole, and feems extreamly pleafed with the Treatment he received from Count Steinbock.

Utrecht Jan. 3. N. S. On the one and thirtieth past, the Ministers of the States General who went lately to the Hague returned hither, and foon after their arrival, they defired a Conference with the British Plenipotentiaries, in which they acquainted their Lordships, that the States their Masters, were come to an unanimous Refolution to concur with Her Majesty's Measures for procuring a General Peace, and at the fame time affured them of the deep Senfe their High Mightineffes have of the repeated Inftances of Friendfhip Her Majefty hath thewn for their Republick during this whole Tran-faction. On Sunday and this Morning, the faid Ministers were again in Conference with their Lordfhips, who have likewife had frequent Conferences of late with the Plenipotentiaries of France, Savoy, and the affociated Circles of Germany. Yesterday Morning those of the Allies met in the Town-house, as usual. Count Sinzendorff is returned hither from the Hague. Monsieur Mellarede, one of the Duke of Savoy's Ministers, is also come from the tame Place, where he stay'd a Day or two on his way from England.

Dover, Decemb. 27. Yesterday his Grace the Duke of Shrewsbury embark'd on board the William and Mary Yatcht, and at Seven a-Clock in the Evening fet Sail with a fair Wind for Calaic, where it is hoped he is now arrived, the Wind having continued fayourable ever fince.
