NOTICE OF PROPOSALS FOR A LICENCE
TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that the Severn-Trent Water Authority (hereinafter called "the Authority") whose head office is at Abelson House, 2297 Coventry Road, Sheldon, Birmingham B26 3PU, has formulated proposals for abstracting the following quantities of water from the underground strata (Bunter Sandstones) at Monk's Dale Borehole, Millers Dale in the Parish of Tideswell, in the district of West Derbyshire, at National Grid Reference SK 1420 7332:—

2,000 cubic metres per day and

550,000 cubic metres per year for public water supply purposes.

Further details of the application are:—

The borehole is currently the subject of licence number 3/28/39/73/G which is due to expire on 28th February 1987, and which authorises the abstraction of 2,272 cubic metres per day and 831,818 cubic metres per year.

The proposals set out in the form of a draft licence together with a map are deposited at the following offices of the Authority's Derwent Division:—

and may be inspected by the public free of charge, at all reasonable hours, during the period beginning on 12th February 1987 and ending on 13th March 1987 inclusive.

At the expiry of the said period, the Authority will be entitled to pass a resolution by virtue of which the licence shall be deemed to be granted unless the Secretary of State for the Environment, either in consequence of any representations made with respect to the proposals, or otherwise, requires an application for the licence to be made to him.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

DYFED COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Dyfed (Tremeyrick Street, Pembroke Dock)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987*

Notice is hereby given that the Dyfed County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of this Order will be:

(1) To prohibit waiting at any time in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

The Order will contain the usual exemptions including the right for passengers to board or alight from a vehicle, for the loading and unloading of goods, for the carrying out of building operations and other works, for the performance of statutory powers or duties, and to enable a vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated adjacent to the length of road affected by the proposed restriction.

In addition, the Order will contain the usual parking concessions for disabled persons in accordance with the Orange Badge Scheme.

Full details of these proposals are contained in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the length of road affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at the offices of the Dyfed County Council at County Hall, Carmarthen, and at the offices of South Pembrokeshire District Council at Llanion Park, Pembroke Dock, during normal office hours.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by 9th March 1987.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980—SECTION 116

Notice of Application to Stop Up Highway

Notice is hereby given that the Dyfed County Council, the highway authority, intends to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Shire Hall, Haverfordwest, on Monday, 6th April 1987, at 10.30 a.m., for an Order that the length of the access road to R.A.F. Brawdy (known as Scarborough Road) commencing 916 metres north-east of its junction with the principal road A.487 (measured along the road centre line) and terminating at the end of the public highway 460 metres east of that commencement point be stopped up for the purposes of all traffic on the ground that it is unnecessary.

LIVERPOOL CITY COUNCIL

Traffic Regulation Orders

Notice is hereby given that on 30th January 1987, the City Council of Liverpool, made the following Orders under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, to become operative on 16th February 1987, the effect of which will be:

1. The City Council of Liverpool (Agate Street) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987, to prohibit, with certain exceptions, any vehicle from waiting at any time on the north-east side of Agate Street from its junction with Breck Road in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 13.7 metres (45 feet).
2. The City Council of Liverpool (Springfield, Queen Anne Street, Harker Street, Birkett Street, Soho Street and Mansfield Street) (Revocation, One-Way Traffic, Prohibition of Waiting and Prohibition of Loading and Unloading) Order 1987:

(a) to revoke the City Council of Liverpool (Soho Street) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1970, in so far as it relates to Soho Street from a point 6 metres (20 feet) south of its junction with William Henry Street to its junction with Everton Brow;

(b) To prohibit any vehicle from proceeding in that length of Birkett Street from its junction with the western side of Pritt Street to its junction with St. Anne Street in a direction other than from west to east; and
