ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Various Streets, Paignton) (Prohibition, Restriction and Limitation of Waiting) Order 1987

Notice is hereby given that Devon County Council propose to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

When the Order comes into effect, you will not be permitted to leave your vehicle:

(1) At any time:

Dartmouth Road east side, from its junction with Goodrington Road southwards to a point 50 metres north of its junction with Saltern Road.

Fisher Street west side, from its junction with St. Michaels Road northwards for a distance of 50 metres

east side, from its junction with Elmsleigh Road to its junction with Grosvenor Road.

Waterside Road both sides, from a point 45 metres (Old A379 Quarry Road) north of its junction by No. 1 Waterside Road northwards for a distance of 80 metres.

(2) Between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily in:

Service Lane at rear of Nos. 16 to 34 Winner Street both sides, whole length.

(3) For a longer period than one hour between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily in:

Gerston Place north side, from a point 6.5 metres west of its junction with Torquay Road westwards for a distance of 10 metres (i.e. outside Gerston Hall).

Exemptions in the Order permit waiting for the purpose of boarding and alighting, loading and unloading, post office services, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water and electricity, pursuance of statutory powers or duties. Statutory exemptions for disabled persons vehicles are included.

Details of the proposal are contained in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the affected lengths of road and a statement of the Council's reason for proposing to make the Order may be examined during usual office hours, Monday to Friday, at the Offices of the Town Clerk and Chief Executive Officer, Borough of Torbay, Town Hall, Torquay, or at Oldway, Paignton.

Any representations on the proposal must be sent to the undersigned in writing by 20th March 1987.

NORTHAMPTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

Northampton Borough Council (Campbell Square) (Parking Place) (Amendment) Order 1987

Notice is hereby given that on 23rd February 1987 Northampton Borough Council pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Northamptonshire County Council in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under sections 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and of all other enabling powers, and, with the consent of Northamptonshire County Council made the above-named Order amending the Northampton Borough Council (Campbell Square) (Parking Place) Order 1975. The effect of the Order which will come into operation on 1st March 1987 will be to redefine Campbell Square Car Park following works in the vicinity as that area bounded by the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, Church Lane and Campbell Street. The existing provisions relating to the position in which vehicles may wait, classes of vehicles, days and hours of operation and charges will apply.

A copy of the Order together with a map illustrating its effect and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, may be examined at my office at 61 Derngate, Northampton during office hours.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or any provision therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under it has been complied with in relation to the Order should within 6 weeks from 23rd February 1987 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
