Notice is hereby given that as provided by Article 4 of the Importation of Animal Products and Poultry Products Order 1980 (as amended) the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Welsh Office Agriculture Department have with effect from 23rd May 1986 issued the following licences with conditions as detailed below:

A. Licence No: (a) TAY/GEN/86/302 (in England). (b) WOAD/GÉN/86/21 (in Wales).

Subject: Liquid or frozen blood plasma derived from bovine animals and swine (not intended for human consumption).

Country: Denmark.

Ports of Entry:

Licence (a) valid through: All ports and airports in England. Licence (b) valid through: All ports and airports in Wales.

Conditions attaching to Licence A

- 1. Each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate signed by a duly authorised veterinary officer of the Government of Denmark stating that:
 - (a) the blood plasma is derived from animals slaughtered in an abattoir licensed for the production of meat for human consumption;
 - (b) the blood plasma is derived from animals which received veterinary ante- and post-mortem inspection by an Official Veterinary Surgeon and showed no evidence of any of the diseases listed in Annex E of EEC Directive 64/432 on animal health problems affecting intra-Community trade in bovine animals and swine;
 - (c) the blood plasma has not been obtained from animals which come from a holding or area which for health reasons is subject to prohibition pursuant to Article 3 (2) (b) of EEC Directive 64/432, as a result of an outbreak of foot and mouth disease; (d) the blood plasma has not been obtained from a slaughterhouse which is under restriction as a result of foot and mouth disease.
- 2. The blood plasma must be transported in sealed containers, which bear a mark to the effect that the blood plasma is not intended for human consumption.
- 3. Any products imported under this licence shall be made available if so required for inspection and/or sampling by an officer of the Ministry at any place nominated by him for such inspection and/or sampling. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him to carry out the inspection and/or sampling in such manner as he shall determine and the importer shall be

responsible for meeting any costs of carrying out such an inspection and/or sampling.

Notice is hereby given that as provided by Article 4 of the Importation of Animal Products and Poultry Products Order 1980 (as amended) the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Welsh Office Agriculture Department have with effect from 2nd June 1986 issued the following licences with conditions as detailed below:

Subject: Dyed Goose Skins.

Conditions attaching to Licence B

Each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate signed by a duly authorised veterinary officer of the Government of France stating

- 1. the skins are derived from geese which:
- (a) were subjected to ante- and post-mortem inspection under veterinary supervision and showed no signs of infectious or contagious disease; and
- (b) originated from flocks in which Newcastle disease and fowl plague (avian influenza) have not occurred during the six months preceding slaughter.
