is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with either diagram 1025.1 or diagram 1025.3 in Schedule 2 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1981 as amended;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1971 as amended by the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975.

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when:

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.

(3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

3. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day other than Sunday in the lengths or sides of the road specified in the Schedule hereto.

4. (1) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of the roads or in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:

- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) goods to be loaded onto, or inloaded from, the vehicle;
- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

(iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of roads;

(iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said sides of the roads or lengths of roads of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878;

- (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953;
- (f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads; or
- (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

(2) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in a relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of roads or on the sides of the roads referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding 2 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same lengths of road on the same day).

5. In so far as any provision of this Order conflicts with a provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act and existing at the time when this Order comes into operation and which imposes a restriction or prohibition on waiting by vehicles other than stage carriages or express carriages in a bus stop area or grants an exemption from such restriction or prohibition that provision of that Order shall prevail.

6. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.

The Hartlepool Borough Council (The Green, North Lane/Various un-named Access Roads (Elwick)) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987.

The Council of the Borough of Hartlepool ("the Council") pursuant to arrangments made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Council of the County of Cleveland in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under section 1 (1) and (2), 2 (1) to (3) and 4 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order shall come into operation on 1st April 1987 and may be cited as The Hartlepool Borough Council (The Green, North Lane/various un-named access roads (Elwick) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987.

2. (1) In this Order:

- 'bus stop area" means any area of carriagway on either of the sides of the roads or in the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Order intended for the waiting of buses which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with either diagram 1025.1 or diagram 1025.3 in Schedule 2 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1981 as amended;
- "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982;
- "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1971 as amended by the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975. (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as

displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when:

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen; and
- (b)in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front or near side of the vehicle.

(3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

3. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the following length of road:

- North Lane
 - (a) On the west side of the road from both of its junctions with The Green and thence in a northerly direction to a point approximately 22 metres north of its junction with "Greenlea".
 - (b) On the east side of the road from both of its junctions with The Green and thence in a northerly direction to its junction with "Greenlea".

The Green

- On the north side of the road from its most easterly junction with North Lane and thence in an easterly direction for a distance of 170 metres approximately.
 (b) On the north side of The Green from a point approximately 28
- (b) On the north side of The Green from a point approximately 28 metres east of its most easterly junction with North Lane and thence in a north-easterly direction on both sides of the access road across the grassed area which leads to The Walk for a distance of approximately 25 metres.
