#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping up of Highways (County of Avon) (No. SW3) Order 1987" authorising the stopping up of a length of Moor Lane, Clevedon.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 30th March 1987, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
