

SOUTH SOMERSET DISTRICT COUNCIL

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

*The District of South Somerset (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit—
Long Load) Order, 198*

South side, from east bank of River
Witham eastwards for 43 metres.

*Avenue Road and
Stonebridge Road*

North side from east boundary of
Welham Street eastwards for 60
metres.

Welham Street

West side, from its junction with East
Street to a point 10 metres south of the
southern boundary of East Street.
West side, between points 18 metres
and 27 metres north of the northern
boundary of Avenue Road.
East side, from its junction with
Stonebridge Road to its junction with
East Street at the north-eastern corner.

Notice is hereby given that the District Council of South Somerset as agents for the Somerset County Council propose to make an Order under sections 84(1) and (2) of and in accordance with Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 the effect of which will be the prohibition of driving of vehicles in excess of 40 m.p.h. on the B3165 at Long Load from 213 yards north of Long Load Bridge southwards to 755 yards south of its junction with Church Lane (a distance of 1648 yards) and the revocation of a previously made Order so as to accommodate the correct distance of the prohibition.

A copy of the Order as drafted, and a copy of the Order to be revoked together with a copy of the relevant maps and a copy of the Statement of Reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at the following places during all reasonable hours:

LINCOLNSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*(Various Streets, Grantham) (Prohibition and Restriction
of Waiting) Order 1987*

Notice is hereby given that the Lincolnshire County Council has made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to impose the following restrictions on the undermentioned lengths of road in Grantham.

No Waiting "at any time"

Harlaxton Road North-west side, from a point 28 metres north-east of the north-eastern boundary of Alexandra Road north-eastwards to a point 55 metres south-west of the southern boundary of Old Wharf Road.

Harlaxton Road South-east side, between points 22 metres and 46 metres and between points 66 metres and 86 metres north-east of the north-eastern boundary line of Alexandra Road.

No Waiting, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.
Agnes Street Both sides and north end.

Agnes Terrace North side
West end
South side, from its junction with Agnes Street, westwards for 10 metres.

Avenue Road North side, from west boundary of Welham Street, westwards for 10 metres.

East Street North side, from east boundary of Agnes Street, eastwards for 10 metres.
South side, from the western boundary of Welham Street, westwards for 10 metres.
South side, between points 23 metres and 39 metres, points 44 metres and 58 metres, points 63 metres and 68 metres, points 73 metres and 80 metres and points 124 metres and 174 metres west of the western boundary of Welham Street.

St. Catherine's Road North side, from a point 25 metres west of the west boundary of Welham Street to a point 40 metres east of the east boundary of Welham Street.

Exemptions are included which will permit waiting for disabled persons' vehicles and for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods, the maintenance of the roads, and works in connection with the supply of gas, electricity and water and any Telegraphic line.

The Order will come into operation on 6th April 1987 with the exception of the waiting restrictions on Avenue Road and Stonebridge Road, which will come into operation on 8th June 1987. A copy of the proposed Order and a plan showing the lengths of road concerned may be inspected at County Offices, Lincoln, and at the offices of the South Kesteven District Council, St. Vincents, Grantham during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders may within 6 weeks after 2nd April 1987 make application to the High Court for this purpose.

RICHMOND-UPON-THAMES BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Richmond-upon-Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction)
(Amendment No. 51) Order 1987*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Richmond-upon-Thames on 30th March 1987 made the above Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order is to further amend the Richmond-upon-Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 so that waiting restrictions are:

- (a) revoked in certain lengths of Wharf Lane and Water Lane, Twickenham;
- (b) extended in a certain length of Arragon Road, Twickenham;
- (c) upgraded in a certain length of Water Lane, Twickenham.

The Order will come into operation on 6th April 1987. A copy of the Order, of the Richmond-upon-Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 (and copies of the Orders which have amended that Order) and of the Council's statement of reasons for making the Order together with plans showing the lengths of roads affected can be inspected at:

- (a) the Offices of the Director of Technical Services, Regal House (2nd Floor), London Road, Twickenham between 9.15 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday;
- (b) Richmond Library, Little Green, Richmond during opening hours;
- (c) Twickenham Library, Garfield Road, Twickenham during opening hours.

Copies of the Order may be obtained from the Department of Technical Services, Regal House, London Road, Twickenham TW1 3QB.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is outside the powers of the Act or that any of the requirements of the Act or regulations made under the Act have not been complied with you may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
