The Papal Galley's are at length arrived at Civita Vecchia, after having fuffered feveral Storms, Signor Mareforfelti hath begun to give Audience, in quality of Auditor of the Pope. On the Fourteenth the Czar arrived there, accompanied by Prince Menzikof and several other General Officers. The Menzikaf and feveral other General Officers. The next day he vifited the Fortifications of the Town, and at his return he was Complimented by feveral Magistrates appointed to wait on him in the Name of the City. On the Sixteenth he went to fee the Ruins of Altens, which feened to affect him ex-treamly, He distributed a confiderable Sum of Ireanity, rie duributed a confiderable Sum of Money amongst the Inhabitants, and promised them large Privileges in their Trade to Archangel, to make them tome Reparation for their Loss. The same Day his Majetty left this Place, and having changed his Refolution of going to Petersberg, he join'd his Army, which he is refolved to Command in Person, in order to remove all Jealousies from the feweral Generals who fcrupled to obey Prince Mer-zikof. Yesterday that Prince docamped, and it was believed would march without any Interruption as far as Rendesbourg, where he is to be joined by Lieu-tenant-General Legard with ro Battalions and 15 Squadrons. The King of Denmark continues fill at Fredericia, from whence he intends to go to the Army as foon as they come near enough for him to do it with Safety. His Majelty is in Treaty with Hus guetan, a French Banker, whom he hath created Baron d'Odyke, to ad ance the Sum of Eight hun-dred thousand Crowns, to pay for the Victuals and Forage of all the Forces belonging to the Northern Allies. Count Steinbock is et prefent socamped with his Army between Husaim and Bredstat, the Van reaching to Flensbourg; and Monfieur Biffewirg, hath tax'd that Qity at Fourteen thouland Crowns, without including the Bailiage. Some Swedish Qfficers have taken two Muscovite Couriers, and they pretend they have met some Letters of Confequence, which have been delivered to Count Welling.
