Hanover', Jan. 27. N. S. The Secretary of Monfieur Fa-brice, Envoy from his Electoral Highneis to the Czar, arbrice, Envoy from his Electoral Highness to the CZar, ar-rived here fome Days ago with an Account, that his Majeffy is refolved to leave the Confederate Army in Holftein, in order to go to fome other Place, where his Prefence is thought more necessary, and that he intends to pass by this Town for fear of falling into the Hands of fome Parties of the Garrifons of Wifmar or Stetin. He was immediately the Garrifons of Wifmar or Sterin. He was immediately fent back with Orders for Monfieur Fabrice to affure the Czar that he fhall be very well received, and a Guard is ordered to be in readinefs to attend him from Harbourg hither, but the time of his arrival is ftill uncertain. We are affitted that the readon of his going from the Army is, the advantageous manner in which the Swedes are polited, that renders it impoffible to attack them, and having Jut-land behind them, they will be able to draw Subilitaace from thence for a long time. It is judg'd from this, that the Czar's defign is to hinder them from joining their King, who is preparing to enter Poland. It is faid the Con-federate Forces will be commanded by Prince Menzikoff in his Ablence. The King of Denmark continues ftill at Fre-deria near Kolding, without being able to fave his Country from the Devaltations of both Armies. The Princefs of Mulcovy is returned with a fmall Attendance from Elbing, to Prince Lewis of Wolfenbuttel, her Father, at Brunfwick.

Bruffels, January 30. N. S. The States of Brabant have directed Count Maldeghem, and the Burgermafter of Loudirected Count Maldegnem, and the Surgermatter of Loos-vain, two of the Deputies fent fome time ago into Holland, to return hither.
