**T**HE Senate hath order'd a Manifesto to be publish'd, to justify their Conduct towards the Pope, in relation to the Business of the Friar Granelli. Signor Grimaldi is gone to Rome, with Instructions from the Republick, to settle their Differences with that See about Ecclesiastical Jurisdictions. They write from Porta Spetia, that the Queen's Ships the Colechester, Dartmouth, Lion and Ormond were gone from thence to Leghorn, in order to take on Board the Provisions that were got ready there for Her Majesty's Fleet. We have received Advice from Barcelona, that General Staremberg had sent his Army into Winter Quarters.

*Venice, February 10. N. S.* Several small Ships are come in here from the Levant. They bring an Account, that the Turks make great Preparations for War. We have received Advice from Rome, that on the thirtieth past a Consistory was held there, and the Pope created four new Cardinals, Monsignor Erba Odescalchi, Archbishop of Milan; the Archbishop of Seville; the Bishop of Barcelona; and the Abbot Polignac. The Marquis de Prie and Monsignor Molinos, have protested against this Promotion, and made no Rejoicings upon it. One Hat remains still vacant, which it is thought is reserved for some Person to be recommended by King Augustus. The Pope found himself very much incommoded by the Fatigue he underwent that Day, and his Asthma is now return'd upon him with as much Violence as ever. The Marquis de Sufa was arriv'd at Rome, and the Electoral Prince of Saxony is expected there in a few Days. They write from Naples, that four hundred Soldiers had been imbark'd on Board several Garrons, and sail'd Westward, without publishing to what Place they are designed.

*Dresden, February 7. N. S.* Yesterday Baron Lewendael, Great Marshal of this Court, set out from hence towards Poland, by which it is thought that the King our Elector intends to continue for some time in that Country. Letters from Warsaw bring an Account, that the Diet had come to a Resolution, that the Army of the Crown should consist of Thirty six thousand effective Men, but they seem'd unwilling to enter upon Ways and Means for maintaining them, till the Great Treasurer had cleared his Accounts, after which it is believed that they will not only raise the necessary Funds for the Subsistence of these Forces, but also of Six thousand Saxons that have been for some time on the Polish Establishment. These Letters add, that the Palatin of Mazovia, Ambassador to the Grand Signior, had sent an Account of his Reception at the Port, very different from what had been given out by those of King Stanislaus's Party; assuring the Court, that he was very well received, was allowed One hundred and fifty Crowns a Day for his Expence, and had been several times in Conference with the Turkish Ministers.

*Copenhagen, February 13. N. S.* The 3d of this Month was observed here as a solemn and extraordinary Day of Prayer and Humiliation to implore the Divine Blessing on the Arms of his Danish Majesty and his Allies. There hath for some time been a Negotiation on foot with Baron Odyche, to engage him to lend the King a considerable Sum of Money, but he hath hitherto lent only Ten thousand Crowns, and insists upon such Conditions for larger Sums; as will hardly be complied with, notwith-

standing the great Necessity we have for Money. This hath obliged the Government to lay some new Taxes on the People. On the 8th Instant two Men of War sail'd from hence to the North Sea, and they are to be follow'd very soon by two more, which with two or three Frigats that are there already, are thought to be sufficient to keep the Swedish Squadron at Gottenburg from venturing to Sea. The 9th being the Anniversary of raising the Siege of this Place, it was celebrated here as usual. Advice is come from Jutland, that the Transport Ships which for some time have been expected from Norway, were at last arrived; but as we have had several Reports before to the same effect, which afterwards prov'd false, we don't yet give an entire Credit to this Account.

*Utrecht, February 24. N. S.* Yesterday the Imperial and French Plenipotentiaries were together in Conference with those of Her Majesty, upon the Subject of evacuating Catalonia, and this Day those Ministers were separately with their Lordships upon the same Affair, and afterwards the French and Prussians were with them about the Interests of their respective Masters. Yesterday the former dispatch'd a Courier to their Court.

*Westminster, February 17.* This Day the Parliament met, and was further Prorog'd to Tuesday the 3d of March.

*Whitehall, Feb. 17.* Major General Pearce, who commanded Her Majesty's Forces in Portugal, is returned hither; he has had the Honour to kiss Her Majesty's Hand, and was very graciously received.

*Whitehall, February 20.* A Conge d'Elire is pass'd under the Great Seal, for electing the Reverend Dr. Ottley Bishop of St. Davids, in the room of the Right Reverend Dr. Bisse, who is translated to the See of Hereford.
