THIS Evening Monsieur Bonet, Resident from Prussia, had a private Audience of Her Majesty, to notify the Death of the late King, and the Accession of his present Majesty of Prussia; to which he was Introduced by the Rt. Hon. the Lord Viscount Bolingbroke, One of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and Conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Master of the Ceremonies.

Madrid, Febr. 13. N. S. The Count de Bergeick hath been employed ever since his Arrival here, in settling the Affairs of the Revenue, in which he hath already made considerable Regulations. The Prince of Santo Buona set out on the 9th for Cadiz, and from thence he is to proceed to Mexico, being constituted Viceroy of that Kingdom. The Princess his Wife is made Lady of the Bedchamber to the Queen. The Marschal de Berwick having caused the Magazines at Rozes and Gironne to be filled with Ammunition and Provisions of all kinds, is gone to Paris. He hath left seventeen Battalions, together with some Regiments of Horse and Dragoons in the Lampourdan, under the Command of Count Fiennes. The Prince of Campo Fiorito and Count Pinto, Brother to the Duke d'Osuna, are likewise gone to the Court of France. The Correspondence between this Kingdom and Portugal is again establish'd. His Majesty's Troops are gone into Quarters in the Kingdom of Valencia, and on the Frontiers of Catalonia, by which it is believed there will be no Action in those Parts till Spring.

Venice, February 24. N. S. The Magistrates of Health have reduced the Quarentine to be perform'd by those who come out of the Empire and Hungary by Land, to eight and twenty Days. Most of the Prussian Troops have pass'd the Po, and are arrived in the Dutchy of Mantua, from whence they are preparing to march through the Veronese into Tirol. They write from Rome, that the Pope was something better, but he could not be prevail'd on to dispose of the vacant Places in the College of Cardinals; and it was thought he would decline the holding a Consistory, till the arrival of the Electoral Prince of Saxony, that he might be present at the Promotion of the Person recommended by the King his Father. Signor Alexandro Grimaldi, Envoy-Extraordinary from Genoa, was come to adjust the Differences between the Pope and that Republick, about the Friar Granelli. A Brother of the Cham of Tartary hath been at Rome for some Days: He had the Privilege of wearing his Hat and Sword in Audience he had of the Pope, who received him with great Marks of Civility. He was converted to the Christian Religion in Spain some Years ago, but the occasion of his Journex to Rome is not known. Upon the arrival of an Express from Paris, with the Resignation of the Bishop of Ypres, a Congregation was immediately called, and Monsieur de Montmoranci, a Frenchman about twenty eight Years old, was made Bishop of that See. Signor Inghiranni, Secretary of the Congregation of the Riti, and Canon of St. Peter's, died lately, in the Eighty first Year of his Age.

Vienna, February 25. N. S. His Imperial Majesty hath appointed Count Tau to be Vice-Roy of Naples, Count Slick to be Chancellor of Bohemia, and Count Thutheimb to be Commissary-General of War. Cardinal Schrottemback is ar-

rived here with a great Retinue from Moravia, is likewise the Count d'Atalaya, General of the Portuguese Troops, from Catalonia; and the Prince de Hohenzolern, Colonel of the Impérial Regiment of Cuirassiers from Hungary. The Prince of Wirtemberg is set out from hence, in order to return to his Government of Landau. The Communication is again opened between this City and the Counties of Oldenburg, Eysenburg, and some other Places which were supposed to have been infected with a Contagious Diltemper, that we are assured is now entirely ceas'd. Orders are likewise given for shortning the Quarentine of those who come from more remote Countries. Our Letters from Adrianople brought very different Accounts of the Affairs of his Swedish Majesty, who continued still at Bender, and it was very uncertain when he intended to leave that Place.

Hanover, March 7. N. S. On the 1st Instant the Czar arrived in this City, and was saluted by the Canon from the Ramparts. The Elector, accompanied by the Electoral Prince, and Duke Ernest, went above a Mile out of Town to meet him, and brought him in his own Coach to the Court, where an Apartment was prepar'd for him. He went immediately to make a Visit to the Electress Dowager, who, accompanied with the Electoral Princess, received him at the Door of her Antichamber, and from thence conducted him into her Closet. The next Day he dined in publick with his Electoral Highness. In the Evening there was a Comedie to entertain him, and afterwards a Ball, at which his Majesty danc'd. On the 4th he set out from hence at six in the Morning: The Elector, the Electoral Prince, and Duke Ernest, accompanied him to his Coach. He din'd at Borgdorff, and went from thence to Soltzdal, where he was met by the Duke of Wolfenbuttel, who came from Brunswick to receive him. Yesterday he left that Place, in order to continue his Journey to Petersburg. He is attended only by his Chancellor and two General Officers, and his Guard consists of twenty Muscovite Dragoons. Major General Groet is come hither from Berlin, to notify the Death of the King of Prussia. On the 5th he had an Audience of the Elector, and the same Day the Court went into Mourning. This Day he had an Audience of Leave, and to Morrow he intends to return homewards. His Electoral Highness hath named Major General Hamerstein to make his Compliments of Condolance to the new King. Monsieur Fabrice, who was lately Envoy to the Czar, is appointed to go with the same Character to his Danish Majesty. We are assur'd that the King of Prussia hath already retrenched several Pentions, and disbanded the Swiss Guards, and that he is making some other Regulations, by which he will be in a Condition to maintain a greater number of Forces at his own Expence, than any of his Predecessors have ever done. Yesterday's Letters from Holstein bring an Account, that the Allies have block'd up Tonningen, and that the King of Denmark being informed that the Swedish Deserters retire to Wismar, hath given Orders that for the future all those who come from this Enemy's Army, shall be sent into Jutland. Advice from Constantinople say, that the Sultan was returned thither from Adrianople, that the Muscovites continued to oppose the War against the Muscovites, and that the Grand Vizir was in danger of being Depos'd.

It being Her Majesty's Royal Intention to Touch publicly for the Evil on Tuesday the 17th of this Instant March, and so to continue for some time; it is Her Majesty's Command, that Tickets be delivered, the Day before at Whitehall, and that all Persons bring a Certificate sign'd by the Minister and Church-Wardens of their respective Parishes, that they never received the Royal Touch.
