The Wigan Borough (Woods Street|Cross Street, Wigan) (Traffic Regulation) Orders 1987

Notice is hereby given that the Wigan Borough Council in exercise of its powers under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, proposes to make the above-mentioned Orders.

The effect of these Orders will be as follows:

Back Bridgeman Terrace, Wigan

To introduce waiting restrictions which would apply 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday on both sides of Back Bridgeman Terrace, from the north westerly kerb-line in Wrightington Street for a distance of 210 metres in a north-westerly direction.

Marsden Street, Wigan

To introduce a prohibition of waiting, loading and unloading on the north west side of Marsden Street, Wigan.

Wallgate, Wigan

To introduce one-way working on Wallgate, Wigan from King Street to Library Street in a north-easterly direction.

Woods Street|Cross Street, Wigan

To impose a prohibition of waiting on the south-east and north-east side of Woods Street from Hodson Street to Cross Street; and on the north-west side of Cross Street from Caroline Street to Woods Street. The Order will also restore two-way working on Woods Street.

There will be limited exceptions permitting vehicles to wait:

- (a) to enable people to board or alight;
- (b) for the purpose of building and similar operations, removing obstructions to traffic, road works and works by statutory undertakers;
- (c) for local authority, water authority and Post Office purposes;
- (d) if the vehicles are fire service or police vehicles or ambulances;
- (e) to take on fuel, water or air at any garage; or
- (f) for the delivery or collection of goods and for loading or unloading.

Copies of the proposed Orders and of the relevant maps, and of statements of the reasons for proposing to make the Orders, and of any Orders to be revoked, may be inspected at the Civic Centre, Millgate, Wigan between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on any day from Monday to Friday.

Any objection to the Orders must be made in writing and specify the grounds thereof and must be made to the Director of Administration, Civic Centre, Millgate, Wigan, not later than 17th September 1987.

ASHFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL

SECTION 277 TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

*Designation of Conservation Area**Extension of Ashford Town Conservation Area*

Notice is hereby given that on 11th December 1986 Ashford Borough Council (the Council) resolved to extend the existing Conservation Area of the town area of Ashford, Kent, having considered it desirable to preserve or enhance the special architectural or historic character or appearance of such further areas of land shown on the Ashford Conservation Area Plan deposited and available for inspection during normal office hours at the Borough Secretary and Solicitor's Department, Civic Centre, Tannery Lane, Ashford, Kent.

There are 6 new areas of land included in the Ashford Town Conservation Area:

- (a) The shopping development known as Park Mall.
- (b) Land to the east of the Ringway encompassing properties within New Street and New Rents.
- (c) The area of Bank Street to its junction with Godinton Road.
- (d) The areas of Tufton Street, Norwood Street and Queen Street, Market Lane, Elwick Lane, the west side of Church Road and the old cinema and the Vicarage Lane Car Park
- (e) The river and adjacent area close to the East Hill Mill and the Ashford School buildings.
- (f) Land at the north end of North Street adjacent to the Ringway and the Employment Agency building between Sainsbury's and North Street.

The effect of designating these additional areas as Conservation Area is that as from 11th December 1986 within these areas the demolition of certain buildings requires the Council's consent; any person proposing to do work to trees is required to give 6 weeks prior notification of his intention to the Council; the Council must formulate proposals for the preservation and enhancement of Conservation Areas; planning applications for developments which would in the Council's view affect the character or appearance of a Conservation Area must be given additional publicity by the Council by way of newspaper advertisement and site notice.
