Madrid, March 13. N. S. H E Prince of Afturias, who for fome time was indifpoled of a Cold, attended with a Fever, is now perfectly recovered. The Queen hath declared. that fhe is three Months gone with Child, which hath occafioned great Joy here, and the Principal Nobility have complimented her Majefly upon that occation. The Suspension of Arms with the Crown of Portugal is renewed for Four Months, and a Correspondence is again settled with that Kirgdom. We have received advice from Catalonia, that a Squadron of British Ships was come into the Port of Barcelona, and that immediately after their arrival, the Empress had declared to the Deputies and Magistrates of the City, that his Imperial Majefty being obliged by the Treaty of Peace, to renounce his Pretensions to the Crown of Spain, and consequently to evacuate Catalonia, the intended to embark for Italy as soon as the Wind would permit. It is thought the States of the Provinge upon this Declaration, will fend Deputies to the King to acknowledge him for their lawful Sovereign. A Courier from Carthagena hath brought an Account, that the Perions who went from thence on the 2d of February laft, to redeem the Captives at Algiers, were returned on the 6th Infant, with Two hundred and eight Slaves, among whom are Fifty Officers, and Eleveri Children.

Vienna, March 22. N. S. On the tork, the Court went into Mourning for the Death of the late King of Prufia. The next Day the Emperod declared Count Schlick, Chancellor of Bohemia, and it, is thought he will be fucceeded in his Poft of Commiffary-General of the Council of War, either by Count Thierheim or Count Althann. Prince Eugene hath already fent away his Equipage to the Low-Countries, intending to follow himfelf in three or four Days. Marihal Daun, who is confituted Vice-Roy of Naples, will fet out about the fame time for that Kingdom. Monfieur Bartkoldi, the Pruffian Minifter, is recalled by the King his Mafter, who hath ordered his Secretary here to tranfach fis Affairs at this Court. The Minifters of the Duke of Guaftalla have received Invefiture in his Name of the States he holds from the Emperor. Laft Night two Express dispatched by the British and Holftein Ministers, at Bender, arrived here. They bring a particular Account of the late Aftion between the Swedds and the Turks, as allo a Confirmation of the King of Sweden's being carry'd away Prisoner to Advianople. Notwithstanding which, our laft Advices from Turky inform us, that the Grand Signiof continues to make great Preparations for a Wan, which he is refolved to puth on with Vigour against the Muscovites, and it is faid he intends to head his Army in Perfore.
