#### **TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971**

#### **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

The Trunk Roads (London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A167)) (De-Restriction) (No 2) Order 1987

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made the above named Order under sections 82 (2) and 83 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
