3. To limit waiting to 40 minutes, return prohibited within 60 minutes between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on the southern side of Beach Road:

(a) from its junction with Beach Terrace as far as its termination at the beach;

(b) from a point 10 metres eastwards from its junction with Beach Terrace to a point 10 metres westwards from the western junction of the service road.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:—

(a) picking up and setting down passengers;

(b) loading or unloading goods;

and where necessary in connection with:—

(c) certain building operations; (d) the maintenance of the road;

(e) the supply of gas, electricity, water or other statutory

undertakings;

(f) the exercise of local authority powers and functions;

(g) the exercise of postal functions;
(h) fire brigade, ambulance and police purposes;
(i) and in certain circumstances when the vehicle is a disabled person's vehicle.
