London, Octob. 9.

N Friday last the Right Honourable the Earl of Offory, with feveral Perfons of Quality, and Officers of his Majesties Diet, went hence to Embark upon the Vactor appointed to pass into Holland

Yachts appointed to pass into Holland, to attend His Highness the Prince of Orange, and to Conduct him into England.

Rome, Sept. 20. The Popes relations are much allarumd by a great fit of the Gout which lately furprifed his Holinefs, and has confined him for feveral days to his bed.

Two Turks who at the fiege of Candia, deferted the Grand Visiers Army, and were fince brought hither, got into the acquaintance of an Armenian Merchant, and fuppoling him to be 1 ich, watched their opportunity to kill the Merchant, intending to have feifed upon his wealth, and afterwards to make their escape, but upon the murther, were detected, and committed to prifon, from whence they endeavoured to free themselves, and in the attempt killed the Goaler, and hurt several of the Guards; but finding themfelves over-powred, they for fome time defended a room in the prison, which they thought to have made good; but this refuge being also for-ced from them, one of them stabbed himfelf with a Inife, but was taken away halfe dead, and publick-'ly executed at the Gate of the prison, the other being committed to fafe cuftody in order to his fentence.

Venice, Sept. 27. Several flups lately arriving from the Levant inform us, that the Grand Segnior taking notice of fome little diffurbance or infurrection of the people in Morea, fent immediately to the Baffa of that place, to proceed rigoroufly against those that were found to be principal actors in the diffurbance, and to raise fome Forts in fuch places, as should be most convenient for the future fecurity of the peace in those parts.

The Visier has endeavoured as much as possible, by all the Methods of Moderation and Sweetness, to work upon the Sultaness and the Janifaries, but hitherto has not succeeded in his design, but the common people who are grown poor by the long absence of the Court, seem very diffrous of the return of the Grand Segnior amongst them.

Chevalier Molino having made use of the Intereft he has with the Grand Vifer, for the benifit of many Christians who successful themselves under his protection, is gone to his place of Refidence at *Bera* near Confunctionale.

The Vifier in a familiar tonference which he had with Chevalier Molino, is faid to have told him, that in his younger dayes he had in the difguife of a Greek, fpent fix years in his fludies at Padua, and for proof thereof, produced a Diploma which was there given him for his degree of Doctor. This week the Senate received a Brief from the

This week the Senate received a Brief from the Pope, authorifing them to proceed in the fale of the Eflates belonging to the Religious houfes which were fupprefied, the moneys thence arifing having been defigned to Reimburfe them for their great ex, pences during the late war with the Turks. The Nuncio has lately follicited the Senate, to take care for the fuppreflion of the Corfairs of *Dulcigno*, who have much diffurbed the Trade of the *Gulfc*; whereupon the Senate has ordered 12 Galeots to be fitted up for this fervice, befides the ufual number of Gallies, with whom are to be joyhed feveral armed Barks belonging to the Ecclefiaflical Effate.

His Excellency my Lord Falconberg was by fome indifposition of body forced to continue feveral dayes at Padoua beyond his expectation; the 2F. he was visited by the two Governours there, viz. the Podesta, and the Capitano Grande with a Train of about 30. Coaches, and all the Nobless, and Complymented, and afterwards prefented with Wines, Flesh, Fish, and Comfitures in the name of the Senate, His Excellency returned the Visits the next day, and intended the day following, to depart thence on his wayfor England.

Vienna, Stpt. 28. The Emperor has had many Confultations with his Ministers of State, about the affairs of Lorrain, at whole prefent condition the Princes and Electors his Neighbors feem much concerned, as at a fire broaken out in the next houfost to them; It is thought convenient at the prefent, to fend an Ambassfador to kis most Christian Mafesty in the name of the Emperor and Empire, to Inquire what farther reasons induced him to this fudden invasion, befides those already alleadged by the Sieur de Gremonville.

The Prince of Lorrain and the Baron de Rifancourt, the Duke of Lorraines Envoy Extraordinary in this Court prefs hard for affiftance, urging it as an Incumbency upon the Emperor and the whole Empire to protect the Duke who is a Member thereof, who is ready upon the producing any juft Charge againft him by his Most Christian Majefty, to make him all reasonable fatisfaction, and to refer all to the judg cment of the General Affembly of the Effates General of the Empire. to the States of the United Provinces, or any other indifferent arbitration.

Tis said the Emperor expects a general Deputation from the whole Empire upon this affair.

The Empress still continues indifposed, upon which account, the Emperor has put off for some time his intended journey of diversion to Ebersdorfe.

The Count Nadafti has been often examined about the late Rebellion in Hungary, but cannot be brought to make confession of his own Guilt, in the matters of which he stands accused; he is now fallen into some distemper of body, for which, two able Physicians are appoynted to take care of him, and a Diet is allowed him out of the Emperors Kitching, which is diligently inspected, least the Count sit is to be made concerning his Crime.

The Count Serini and Marquis de Frangipani are fill at Nieufiadt, under a constant Guard of 49. fouldiers.

• On the 20th inftant was held a great Gouncil about the affairs of Hungary, where were prefent the Archbishop of Gran, and some others of the Principal Nobility of that Kingdom; after all tiv believed it will be concluded necessary for some time, at least, to keep strong Garrisons in Upper Hungary, which must be maintained at the Expences of the several Counties and Commonalties there, besides what shall be advanced upon that account, out of Estates which are under Confiscation.

The En peror is raising fresh Souldiers for the forming of some new Regiments, and the increasing the old Army to the number of 20000. foot and 10000. horse, beside the Garrisons, in which are employed about 20000. more.

The King of *Poland* having fixed a day for the folemn Coronation of the Queen at Warfaw, has fent hither a Gentleman of his Chamber, one Westel, fon to the late Palatin of *Plosco*, to invite their Imperial Majesties to that folemnity. The Count de Schafgotz who is now in Silesta, is made choice of by the Emperor to assist there in his room, and has sent him his Commission for that purpose.

We are here in expectation of the arrival of an Envoy extraordinary from Michael Abaffi Prince of Transituania.

Hambourg, Octob. 7. From Reuel we are told, that General Wrangle was at his arrival there honourably received and faluted by all their Canon, as he was afterwards in the visit he made round the place to view the Forthications. The Second past he was Treated by the Citizens in the Town-house with much liberality, and the noife of all the Artillery; the Sixth of the fame moneth he was entertained by the black Fraternity, amongs whom he was pleased to enter his name, according to the example of King Gustaplus Adolphus, and the next day departed thence on his return for Sweden.

The Heer Heinfus, late Envoye from the States-General of the United Provinces to the Czar of Mufcovy, is lately arrived at Stockholme, much indifpofed by reason of his long travel.

The Court was there expected the 5th inflant, but the Council arrived fome days before with the Chancellor, to whom the French Refident made his addreffes, to inform him, that the most Christian King his master was fending thither the Marquis d'Angeau, with the Character of his Ambassador to that Crown.

Notice being given, that many of the Swedish Seamen had been entertained at Gottenbourg with intention to fend them into France, Orders were immediately dispatched thither to put a stop to the designe, and prevent them from embarking.

All our *Greenland* Fisher-ships are returned home except one which was cast away.

The Magistrates of this City are dispatching Two of their Deputies into England, to endeavor to compound for the satisfaction of those perfons which were concerned in the loss of the strips in the Elve, during the late war.

From Erford we are told, that the Two Lorrain Regiments of Horse which were there, intended in few days to march thence towards *Hombourg*, there to attend the Commands of the Duke their Master.

From feveral parts of *Poland* we are informed, that the Army was indeed confederated, but their defigne was only for prefervation of the honour of their General, and not at all to act any thing against the interest of the King.

The Comte de Hern in Nunez, Envoye Extraordinary from the Court of Sptin, is arrived at Warfuw, as is alfo the Heer de Wit, Ambaffador from the States of the United Provinces. The Diet proc eds very temperately and mildly against the Grand Treasurer and other p rfons The Primare is fully reconciled to the Court, and the Diet generally inelined to aft heartily for the interest of the King and Kingdom.

The Clergy of Poland have prevailed with the sing to ford a Commission into Prussia to inquire upon what account the Anabaptifis are permitted and countenanced in that Countrey: thus Commiffion is like to take place in the Countrey, but those of that fect, inhabitants of Dantzig, have made their applications to their Magistrates, and perfwaded them to protest against the Commission, thinking themselves obliged to protect their own Ci² tizens.

Hague, Oflob. 14. On Saturday the 4th inftant the States of Holland adjourned themfelves till the 4th of November next enfueing, without fixing upon any way of raising moneys for their new intended Leavies, and the Fleet which they defigne to put out to fea the next Spling, which is to confift of 48 of their beft men of war, 16 lighter Fregats, and 12 Fire-fhips.

The Bishop of Strasbourg has been lately at Maesfricht, where he complained to the Rhinegrave of the entertainment he met with from his Excellency the Count de Monterey, who refused to give him a particular Andience, without leave from the Court at Madrid, and that in the conference he had with him in the Church of Nosfre Dame du Lac, he refused to discourse with him upon any affairs of great concernment.

His Highness the Prince of Orange having received the compliments of the States-General, and those of Holland upon his intended pasage into England, expects the arrival of the Yachts, defigned for his transportation, defigning to embark about the 20th instant.

The Heer Beverning has at the last accepted of the employment as Ambassador-from the States-General to the Court of Spain, and is preparing for his journey, which he intends to begin in few weeks.

The States have thought fit 'o fond to the Heer de Groot, their Ambaffador at the Court of France, to enter speedily upon the executio of what is given him in charge, by vertue of his Commission; and in case of the continuance of his indisposition of body, to commit the care of it to Secretary *Rompf*, who is orderd to continue for a year longer at Paris.
