HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The London-Fishguard Trunk Road (Nant-Y-Caws—Coed-Hirion By-pass) Order 1987

The London-Fishguard Trunk Road (Nant-Y-Caws—Coed-Hirion By-pass side roads) Order 1987

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made the following Orders:

1. An Order under section 10 of the Highways Act 1980, which will:

- (a) provide that roads which he proposes to construct along the following routes shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation:

(i) a route about 2820 metres in length in the Communities of Llanfannor and Llanddarog in the County of Dyfed, and

(ii) a route about 350 metres in length in the said Communities and County; and

- (b) provide that the lengths of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road A48 to be superseded by the new trunk roads mentioned above, shall cease to be trunk roads as from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the County Council of Dyfed (who will become the highway authority responsible for these lengths) that the said new trunk roads are open for through traffic, and

2. An Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, authorising him:

- (a) to carry out the improvement of highways,
- (b) to stop up highways,
- (c) to construct new highways,
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises; and
- (e) to provide new means of access to premises,

all in the Communities of Llangunnor and Llanddarog, and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Dyfed, as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

Copies of the Orders and the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 4th December 1987 to 15th January 1988 or within 6 weeks from the date of publication of the Notice whichever period shall expire later at the Offices of Dyfed County Council, County Hall, Carmarthen, Carmarthen District Council, Council Offices, Spilman Street, Carmarthen; the Post Office, Nantycaws; the Post Office, Llanddarog, and at the Welsh Office, Roads Administration Division, Phase 1, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by either of the Orders and desiring to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Orders, may within 6 weeks from 4th December 1987, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of either of the Order or of any provisions contained therein.

The Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (The Friary, Cardiff) Order 1987

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has, on the application of the South Glamorgan County Council, made the above Order under section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 extinguishing, subject to some exceptions, any rights persons may have to use vehicles on the length of highway described in the Schedule to this notice.

he may within 6 weeks of 4th December 1987 apply to the High Court for suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained herein.

Any person who, at the time of coming into force of the Order, has an interest in land having lawful access to the length of the highway to which the Order relates shall be entitled to be compensated by the South Glamorgan County Council as a local planning authority in
