



Forces, consisting of Sixteen thousand Men, which were Cantoning in Brabant, have received Orders to retire from that Country, and to march towards the Upper Rhine to join the Army the Emperor intends to gather there. Letters from St. Malo say, that Monsieur Cassart, with the Squadron under his Command, had made himself Master of Curacao, an Island in the West Indies, belonging to the Dutch.

*Utrecht, May 5. N. S.* On the 3d Instant Baron Kirchner, Plenipotentiary of his Imperial Majesty, was in Conference with the Lord Privy Seal. The same Day Count Gros, who had been dispatch'd to Turin with the Treaty of Peace between France and Savoy, returned from thence with his Royal Highness's Ratification. Yesterday the Commissioners of the Queen, and the States General, for settling the Trade in the Spanish Netherlands, had a Meeting on the Subject of their Commission at the Lord Privy Seal's House, and the Dutch Ministers were likewise present. Monsieur Spanbroeck, whom the Province of Zeland hath nam'd for their Plenipotentiary, in the room of Monsieur Mirmont, deceased, hath this Day made a formal notification of his arrival to all the Ministers.
