Notice is hereby given that the Gloucestershire County Council have made an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 affecting the road being constructed between Park Road at its junction with Parkend Road and the junction of Southgate Street and Bristol Road and which will be known as Trier Way in the City of Gloucester.

The effect of the Order is:

- to prohibit any vehicle proceeding along a road specified in Schedule I to this Notice from making a 'U' turn at any of the locations specified in the Schedule in relation to the road so as to proceed in the opposite direction;
  to prohibit any vehicle from making a left-hand turn from any of the roads specified in column 1 of Schedule II to this Notice into any of the roads specified in column 2;
- to prohibit any vehicle from making a right-hand turn from the road specified in column 1 of Schedule III to this Notice
- to impose a left-hand turn only for vehicles proceeding from the Park access road into Trier Way;
  to prohibit any vehicle proceeding along Trier Way from entering Parkend Road at its westernmost junction with Trier Way
- 6. to prohibit any vehicle from being driven into a boxed area of the southbound carriageway of Trier Way at its junction with the access road leading to Midland Road, known as California Crossing, and being marked by cross-hatched yellow lines bounded by a yellow line on the carriageway when it becomes necessary owing to the presence of stationary vehicles for any part of the vehicle to remain at rest within the area.

#### Prohibition of 'U' Turns

1. Trier Way

The gap in the rectangular traffic islands immediately opposite the junction with Park Road.

- 2. Trier Way The eastern end of the central reservation which lies opposite the junction with the kerb-line of the north side of the easternmost slip road from Southgate Street.
- 3. Trier Way/Bristol Road (A.430)
- The gap in the central reservation opposite the junction with Southgate Street.

Bristol Road (A.430)

The gap in the central reservation opposite the junction with Stroud Road (B.4072).

5. Bristol Road (A.430)

The south end of the central reservation which lies opposite the junction with the kerb-line on the south side of Stroud Road.
