To the *QUEEN's* most Excellent Majesty,

WE Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects the Mayor and Commonalty of the City of *New Sarum*, having always borne a grateful Part, in acknowledging the glorious Successes of Your Arms during the War; do, with a hearty Joy and Affection, beg leave to Congratulate Your Majesty upon the more valuable Blessing of Peace, now so happily concluded, which as it has been effected by Your Majesty's wise Conduict, we are persuaded is not only Honourable and Advantageous to Your own People, but Safe, Just and Reasonable for all Your Allies.

The steady Resolution Your Majesty has shewn in attaining the happy End of Your pious Endeavours, thro' the many Difficulties contrived to Obstruict the same, requires our greatest Applause; and we cannot also but do Justice to the Merit and Fidelity of those who have had the Honour to serve Your Majesty in perfecting this great Work.

The many groundless Fears and Jealousies which have been factiously invented and industriously spread abroad, with Design to alienate Your People's Affections, and to bring Reproach upon Your Majesty's happy Administration and Government, give us a just Abhorrence of such wicked Practices, when we have so eminent Proofs of Your tender Regard and Concern, not only for our present Happiness, but of our Posterity; also by the Care You have taken to secure the Interest and Friendship of the Illustrious House of Hanover, which is the greatest Blessing (next to those we enjoy under Your Majesty) that can attend us, and for which, future Ages will be obliged to bless Your Majesty's glorious Memory.

The following Address from *Jamaica* was presented to Her Majesty,

To the *QUEEN's* most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Governor, Council, and General Assembly of *Jamaica*.

Most Gracious Sovereign!

WE Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Governor, Council, and General Assembly of Your Majesty's Island of *Jamaica*, having had the Happiness to see the Terms of Peace which Your Majesty has been graciously pleased to Communicate to our Parliament, humbly beg Leave, with the rest of our Fellow-Subjects, in the plainest but sincerest manner, to Congratulate Your Majesty thereupon.

We presume not, Madam, to judge of the Interests of Empires or States, nor to determine future Events; but we cannot refrain from expressing our Joy, as well as our Gratitude to Your Majesty (tho' in Words much inferior to what we feel in our Breasts) at the Prospect of a Peace, which appears to us so Equitable, so Honourable and so Advantageous; nor can we conceive what room there is left to any, for Fears or Jealousies, whilst Your Majesty, whom the Almighty has made his Instrument, in rescuing Nations from Slavery, is concerting the means of their Security.

The Immortal Honour Your Majesty has acquired in so successful a War, could only have received an

Addition by the Establishment of such a Peace, wherein You may be truly said to gain the greatest Victory, in putting a stop Your self to the Torrent of Your own Successes, and in the midst of Triumphs, as soon as Tyranny and Oppression are subdued, by laying aside the Terror of Your Arms, to give the World the pleasing Delights of Liberty in Peace.

For our Parts, Madam, as we are deeply sensible we owe our Safety, during the Course of a long and bloody War, to the Protection Your Majesty has been pleased to give us; so we have entire Confidence and Satisfaction in that Provision we humbly hope Your Majesty has already made for our Security and Prosperity in a Peace; and for this and all the other Blessings of Your Majesty's Reign, we can only continue our Loyalty (that is to say, our Duty) to Your Sacred Person, and our Prayers to God to grant Your Majesty all desirable Felicity upon Earth, and, for Your Peoples sake, a late Retirement to his Glory.

The following Address from the City of *Edinburgh*, was presented to Her Majesty by *Sir Patrick Johnston*, their Representative in Parliament; being introduced by the Right Hon. the Earl of *Finletter*.

To the *QUEEN's* most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of *Edinburgh*.

Most Gracious Sovereign!

ALBERT we lie at a distance from the Seat of Government, and far removed from Your Majesty's Person, yet the Blessings of Your auspicious Reign are so diffus'd, that they reach even us, and the outmost Parts of Your Majesty's Dominions. It is therefore from the deepest Sense of Duty and Gratitude, that we presume with the first of Your loyal Subjects to Congratulate Your Majesty upon the happy Success of a long expected Peace, now at length brought about by the Blessing of Heaven upon Your Majesty's Endeavours.

And we have the greatest Satisfaction to observe Your Majesty's kind Care, in consulting the Good of all Your Subjects, particularly by extending the Trade of these Kingdoms beyond any thing that former Times can boast of: Neither has Your Majesty been unmindful of the just Interests of Your Allies, to whom, in the whole Course of the Treaty, the most tender Regards have been had: And therefore, as it is chiefly by Your Majesty's Mediation that *Janus's Gate* is now shut, so we hope it shall not be in the Power of Your inveterate Enemies once more to open the same.

As we are fully persuaded that the Happiness of all Your Subjects depends upon a perfect Friendship betwixt Your Majesty and the House of Hanover, so Your Care of the Succession in that Illustrious House, is a convincing Proof of Your utmost Zeal for the Protestant Religion, seeing by this Expedient, the same will be transmitted to latest Posterity.

And now that Your Majesty has overcome so many Difficulties, in bringing this great Work to a happy Issue, as it lays upon us the strongest Obligations to Loyalty and Obedience, so also earnestly to pray, That it would please the Almighty to Shew down upon Your Majesty the Best of his Blessings, and preserve You, not only to mainain our religious and civil Liberties, according to the Articles of Union, but also to enjoy the Fruits of Your indefatigable Labours in the Establish'd Peace of Your Subjects. That after You have long Reign'd here in their Hearts and Affections, Your Majesty may Reign with GOD in Glory for ever.
