Lisbon, April 25. N. S. The Duke de Codaval hath left the Court in Difgust, which it is faid proceeds from the King's having declared, contrary to the Advice of his Council, that his Natural Brother should marry a Lady of the Family of Oronches. As foon as this Marriage is confummated, he is to be created à Duke, with the Title of Highness. All the Relations of the Oronches have been at Court, to thank his Majesty for this great Honour. We have received Advice from Cadiz, that feven Ships of the Flotilla, which went from Spain in the Year 1711, were arrived there; and it is suppofed the other two are got into the Groyne. The nine Sail are faid to be worth Twelve Millions of Dollars, in Money and Goods. Madrid, May 1. N. S. Don Fernando

Figuera, who is to go to Genoa in Quality of Envoy-Extraordinary from his Catholick Majesty, is nominated Governor to the Prince of Asturias. Two Days ago Monfieur Orry arrived here from Paris,' and was met out of Town by the Chief Minifters and Grandees. The Execution of Count Bergeick's Project for regulating the Finances, was deferred till his arrival. Count Bergeick hath fet up a Manufactory of Cloth at Valdemora, four Leagues from hence. He hath brought Workmen from Flanders, and to encourage them the King hath dispatch'd an Order, that they shall

very of his Health. The Prince of Sauctobueno having been very much indifpofed of the Gout at Port St. Maries, the Phylicians have advised him not to venture out of Europe, from whence it is thought the Duke de Varaguas will be conftituted Vice-Roy of Mexico or Peru, instead of Navarre. His Majefty hath made a Prefent of a Sword fet with Diamonds, of a confiderable Value, to Monfieur Guerchy, a French Lieutenant-General, in requital of his good Services. The Duke de Montalto hath acquainted their Majesties, that he hath concluded a Match between his Grandson the Duke of Fernandina and the Grand-daughter of the Duke of Medina-Sidonia, which is approved of. A Courier from Catalonia having brought Advice, that Marefchal Staremberg had received the Emperor's Order for evacuating that Province, the Duke de Popoli is preparing for his departure thither; and the Intendant of his Army hath already received Three hundred thousand Crowns to put them in motion. They write from Bifcay, that they have cut down Wood there for building fix large Ships, and three Frigats.

Hamburgh, May 9. N. S. We have received Advice, that the Treaty for the Surrender of Tonningen being broke off, by reason that the King of Denmark infifted to be fole Mafter of it as foon as it fhould be evacuated by the Swedes, without admitting any of the Troops of Holftein into the Garrison, the Trenches before the Place were opened on the 6th without much Lofs. On the 11th it is to be Bombarded, according to the Scheme of General Scholten, who propoles in Four and twenty Hours to throw in Eleven hundred Bombs of One hundred and fifty Pound Weight. On the 6th, at Night, Count Steinbock made a Sally on the Muscovites, and killed Seven hundred of them: But the next Day they returned to the Charge, and repulsed the Swedes with the Lofs of Five hundred Men. Notwithstanding the King of Denmark's Orders to the Muscovites, who are coming from Pomerania, not to enter Holftein, they continue their March with great Expedition towards Frederichstadt. His Danish Majesty hath sent a Message to Baron Goertz,

requiring him to be gone immediately from Husun. Utrecht, May 12. N. S. On the 10th the Mini-, sters of France, and three of those of the States-General, had a Conference in the Presence of Her Majefty's Plenipotentiaries, at the Lord Privy Seal's House ; where they agreed to defer the exchange of their respective Ratifications, till the return of their Collegues from the Hague; and at the fame time the French Ministers delivered to those of Great Britain the Act whereby the Elector of Bavaria yields the Spanish Netherlands to the House of Auîtria. Yesterday Morning the Ministers of France and Pruffia met at the Earl of Strafford's, and exchanged the Ratifications of their Treaty of Peace, and afterwards the Queen's Plenipotentiaries had a Conference with Baron Kirchner, the Emperor's Minister. Last Night the Plenipotentiaries of the States-General returned from the Hague, and had a nath unpatting an Order, that they shall be exempt from all Civil Jurisdiction.
