Men. This gives great Jealousie to the Princes his Neighbours. We have yet no certain Account of Count Schonborn's Negotiation at that Court; but it is said the Ministers have told him, their Master would surnish no more than his Contingent, which is Five thousand Men; that the Treaty by which his Majesty engag'd to supply the Emperor with Eight thousand Men, till the House of Austria was in Possession of Spain, can't be of any validity since the evacuation of Catalonia. Count Schonborn intending to stay some time longer at Berlin, hath sent Count Hamilton with Dispatches to Hanover.

Paris, May 13. N.S. The King went some Days ago to Marly, where he intends to continue till Whitfun-Eve, and then he will return to Versailles. On the 10th and 11th, his Majesty review'd the Four Troops of Life Guards, which contain Four hundred Men in each Troop. Mareschal d'Harcourt hath had a Fit of an Appoplexy, which it is thought will hinder him from being able to Command this Summer, if there should be occasion for employing an Army. The Duke of Shrewsbury's Publick Entry is appinted to be on the last of this Month. On the 10th, his Grace received an Express from the Ministers of Savoy, desiring him to intercede for an Order from this Court, for evacuating Savov. Nice, and other Places. The King ating Savoy, Nice, and other Places. granted it immediately, and Directions to that Purpose were sent this Morning to the Comanding Officers on the Frontiers, by which means his Royal Highness will soon be in possession of all his Country.
