THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The London-Fishguard Trunk Road (Carmarthen Southern By-Pass Side Roads) Order 1988

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes, in relation to the above-mentioned Trunk Road at Nant-y-Caws, in the county of Dyfed, to make an Order under section 14 of the Highways Act 1980 which will authorise him to stop up a highway at Nant-y-Caws aforesaid.
