Vaudemont, fon to the Duke of Lorrain, and had prefently an Audience from the Emperor, to whom he gave a particular and exact account of the Invalion of *L* rrain by the French; feveral conferences have been had upon this fubject with the Deputies from the Ehectors of Mayence and Treves, the Deputy from Lorain, and the Emperors Commiffioners appointed for this affair, who have purposed to enter into a new League for the defence of the Circle of the Rhine, but this is not yet refolved on.

The Marquis de los Balbaces Spinola, Ambastador from Spain is arrived at Nieubourg, Three Leagues from this place, where he intends to continue till he has made all due preparations for his folenin entity.

The Heer Bruininx, employed hither by the States-General of the United Provinces, as Refident in this Court, has had his first Audience from his Imperial Majesty, and another from the Prince dc Lobkowitz.

The Count Nadafii is recovered from his diftemper, and fince conveyed from the Provincial houfe to the Caftle,; he continues to deny all the Charge which is brought against him, fwearing, and folemuly protesting, that fince the pardon which the Emperor was pleased to give him upon the confpiracy formed against him, in the time of the late Palatine Weffelin, he never entertained any defigne against his fervice and interess, but was always cateful to manifest his Loyalty according to his Oasth of Allegeance. This notwithstanding, Two of the principal perfons concerned in the late Rebellion, are brought hither prisoners from Hungary, who are in few days to confront him.

Genoua, Sept. 27. This last week arrived here from Lerice, one of the Gallies belonging to the squadron of this place with the Cardinal Maidalchino, who was for some days lodged in Cardinal Raggi's Pallace, where he was honourably entertained, during which time he took a view of the curiosities of this place, and on Thursday last embarked again for France on his way to Paris.

The 21 inftant arrived here the New Ferufalem from Legorn, to lade Goods for Spain and Portugal, but will compleat her fraught at Legorn.

Segnior Hippolico Centurione is ftill here with his Three Gallies.

From Milan we are told, that the Governor the Duke d'Offuna had given out his Orders for the changing of all the Garrifons within his Government, which will be fpeedily put in execution, and has fent feveral Spanish Officers to Barcellona to rate men for the recruits of the Tertias of that Nabut as yet we hear nothing farther of any remation intended.

The Governour is fending Count Hercules Viftinti, the Commiffary-General of his Army to Florence, to compliment the Great Duke.

The Dutchels d'Offuna was the 11th inftant happily brought to bed with a Daughter, upon which account the Duke has received the Compliments of the whole Court.

From Turin they write, that the Duke of Savoy has fent an Engineer, Vodan, to take a view of the Fortifications of Vercelli, and feveral other places under his Dominions, who at his return is to give his Highnefs an account of what is farther fit to be done for the strengthening of them, and of his defign for the enlargement of the City of Turin.

The Venetian Ambaffador in that Court has ended his vifits, and taken leave of the Court, and is gone thence by the way of the Po on his return for Venice. Bruffels, Octob.15. A Courier lately arriving from

Bruffels, Octob.15. A Courier lately arriving from Spain, gives us an account, that the Countels de Monterey was gone from Madrid, and lodged the 26th paft at Burgos on her journey hither, taking the way of *France*: upon the first news of her ap \overline{z} proach, his Excellency intends to meet her upon the frontiers.

A confiderable number of the Foot in every Province within this Government is lately refo med; a Mufter is fhortly expected of the remaining forces, and an eftablishment for their conftant pay, which will be a means to keep the foldiery in better difcipline and to preferve the Companies full and intire, which are many of them much leffened through the defect thereof.

In Antwerp a Council is lately met, confifting of an Herald at Arms, Two Members of the Councel of *Brabant*, a Greifier, a Fifcal, and others, to put in execution a Placart which was publisht about roo years fince, against all excesses in Coaches, Servants, Liveries, Apparel, Gc. upon which account they have proceeded against feveral perfons.

Paris, Odob. 15. On Saturday last feveral Companies marched away towards Lorrain for the recruits of the Army, which is now almost entirely posses of that Countrey.

His Majesty intends on Sunday to return to Verfailles, and has declared his resolution to pass the Christmas in this City, and to continue here till the beginning of February.

Some days fince happened a great fire at the Town of *Chaftillon*, in the Soveraignty of *Dombes*, belonging to Madamoifelle d' Orleans, which in little time confumed about 400 houfes and Two Churches.

Hague, Octob. 17. His Highnefs the Prince of Orange is preparing for his voyage into Endland, expecting daily the arrival of the Yachts which are to attend him for his transportation. The Council of State have employed Two of

The Council of State have employed Two of their Deputies to Maeftricht, to take a view of all the flores as well as the flrength of that place, and to put it into fuch a poflure as to enable it, upon occafion, to endure a long Siege 3 feveral frefh Companies of Foot are alfo to be fent thither with res cruits for the prefent Garrifon, which is to be increafed to the number of 8000 or 9000 men. The Rhinegrave who defigned to tontinue fome time here, is defired alfo to repair thither to take care of his Government, and tis believed he will find it convenient to continue there all the winter.

The Heer *Beverning* will fuddenly receive his difpatches, and may about *Alhallontide* fer forwards on his Embaffie for *Spain*, and intends to pafs by fea as far as *Bilboa*, or *St Sebaftien*.

Several of the Domeflick fervants which lately belonged to the Prince *de Tarante*, are arrived here, finding little encouragement to continue in his fervice, without parting with their Religion.

His Excellency the Count de Monterey, Governour of the Spanish Netherlands, has lately sent tor inform the States, that Bills of Exchange are sent over from Spain, for the payment of the Subsidies due to the Swedes.

The Heer de Groot received not his Orders from the States to proceed in his Commiffion, till after the departure of the French Court to Chambourg, fo that nothing can be done effectually in that affair till the return of his most Christian Majesty.

Lime, Oftob. 8. This laft week arrived here the Hope, the Rofe, and the Charity of this place from Rotterdam; the 5th inftant the Elizabeth of the fame place from Hambourg, and yesterday the Greyhound from Dublin, and the Mary from Morlaix.
