#### UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

A Statute made by the Governing Body of Pembroke College, in the University of Oxford on 15th January 1988, amending Statute IV has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and this notice is published in accordance with the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923. The Statute enables supplies income from the College's Atkinson Scholarship to be applied to assist resident members of the College receiving instruction.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday. 5th February 1988 at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877 and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.
- The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, 8th February 1988 to Friday, 12th February 1988, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Notification will be sent on the day of the Tender to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of an accepted Tender must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash, banker's draft payable through the Town Clearing or by cheque drawn on the Bank of England, not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated and on which they are to be collected from the

- 7. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right to reject any Tenders.

#### PROPOSED STOPPING UP OF VARIOUS HIGHWAYS AT KIRBY MERSEYSIDE
