TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 19th February 1988, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877 and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.
2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, 22nd February 1988, to Friday, 26th February 1988, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
5. Notification will be sent on the day of the Tender to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of an accepted Tender must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash, banker's draft payable through the Town Clearing or by cheque drawn on the Bank of England, not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated and on which they are to be collected from the Securities Office.
6. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Securities Office, Bank of England.

7. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right to reject any Tenders.

MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971 - SECTION 12

SUSPENSION OF DIRECTION PROHIBITING EXERCISE OF POWERS IN RELATION TO CONTROLLED DRUGS

In accordance with Section 12(4) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State has given the following direction which came into force on 15 January 1988:

"Whereas on 9 June 1984 the Secretary of State gave a direction under Section 12(2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 in respect of William James Collins, a pharmacist whose registered address is 46 Gresham Road, Staines, TW18 2AN, prohibiting him from having in his possession, manufacturing, compounding and supplying and from supervising and controlling the manufacture, compounding and supply of any controlled drug within the meaning of the Act:

Now, therefore in pursuance of Section 12(3) of that Act, I hereby direct that the said direction be suspended."
