(1) In this Order:
"bus stop area" means any area of carriageway on either of the sides of the road or in the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Order intended for the waiting of buses which is comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with either diagram 1025.1 or diagram 1025.3 in Schedule 2 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1981 as amended;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982:

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1971 as amended by the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 1975.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when:
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and

(b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on thefront

or near side of the vehicle.

(3) Except where otherwise stated any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or

Schedule bearing that number in this Order:
Save as provided in Articles 4 and 5 of this Order no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the following lengths of roads:

Clavering Road From a point approximately 15 metres west of its junction with Sunningdale Grove and thence in a westerly direction for a further 50 metres approximately.

(1) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of the roads or in the lengths of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:

(a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;

(b) goods to be loaded onto, or unloaded from, the vehicle; (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:

(i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
(ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
(iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the

said lengths of roads;

- (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said side of the road or length of road of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraphic Act 1878;
- (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

(e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post

Office Act 1953;

(f) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said lengths of roads; or (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police

purposes.

(2) Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in a relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the lengths of roads or on the sides of the roads referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding two hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same lengths of roads on the same day).

Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with a previous which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act and existing at the time when this Order comes into operation and which imposes a restriction or prohibition on waiting by vehicles other than stage carriages or express carriages in a bus stop area or grants an exemption from such restriction or prohibition that provision of that Order shall prevail.

The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to

and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement

imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
