PURBECK DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Purbeck District (On-Street Parking Places) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the Purbeck District Council proposes to make the above-mentioned Order under section 45 and 46 of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984.

The proposed Order designates parts of several highways as on-street parking places in Wareham namely The Quay, St. Johns Hill and Church Green and provides for the making of charges for parking and otherwise for the regulation of the designated parking places.

When the Order comes into operation it will have the following effect:

- (1) Specify the classes of vehicles that may use the above mentioned parking places as being motor cars within the provisions of section 136(2) of The Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984.
- (2) Introduce controls and restrictions in which the above mentioned parking places may be used.
- (3) Specify the following charging and other provisions in respect of these parking places:
 - (a) Prescribe the maximum period for which authorised vehicles may wait in the parking places as being two hours between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.
 - (b) Specify charges of 15p per hour or part thereof between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.
 - (c) Make an excess charge of £20 for parking without a ticket or beyond the time allowed which will be reduced to £10 if payment is made within 14 days of the date of issue of the excess charge ticket. All such charges being inclusive of Value Added Tax where appropriate.
