### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an order under section 212 of the above Act entitled "The Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (London Borough of Southwark) (No. 1) Order 1988". The Order comes into operation on 20th May 1988 and extinguishes any right which persons may have to use vehicles (other than those specified in Schedule 2 to the Order) on a length of Delaford Road, London S.E.16.
