That length of the Dolgellau-South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (A494) known in part as High Street and in part as Station Road, Bala in the County of Gwynedd which extends from the junction of the trunk road with Aran Street in a north-easterly direction to the junction of the trunk road with Ffrydan Road, a distance of 535 metres. (3 SI)

The Trunk Road (A494) (High Street, Bala, Gwynedd) (Bus Stop) (Clearway) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to prohibit, with certain exceptions, the waiting of vehicles, other than buses, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day along any area of that length of highway specified in the schedule to this notice which is marked as a bus stop, and with a broad yellow line adjacent to the edge of the carriageway.

The proposed Order revokes The Trunk Road (High Street, Bala) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1970 insofar as it relates to any prohibited area of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice.
