Draft Stopping Up of Highways (County of Hereford and Worcester) (No.) Order 19

The Worcester Central Area Redevelopment Compulsory Purchase Order 1988

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that a joint local inquiry is to be held into:

- a draft Order, proposed to be made by the Secretary of State for Transport under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971. If made, the Order would authorise the stopping up of lengths of Dolday, Broad Street Rear Access Road, Bank Street, Broad Street and Angel Place, and the entire lengths of Powick Lane, Bull Entry and High Street Rear Access Road, and a length of footpath known as Rack Alley all in the City of Worcester, enabling redevelopment of the town centre to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of the said Act.
- an Order submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation as made by the City of Worcester under section 112 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 and under section 13 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 authorising them to acquire compulsorily for the purpose of development, redevelopment or improvement for shops, offices, bus station, car park and related activities of the land at Blackfriars Square
