Warfam, August 20. N. S. King Augustus has fent repeated Orders to his Troops that are on their way hither from Flanders and Saxony, to halten their March into this Kingdom, and it is fuppoled shey will arrive in Ten or Lwelve Days. We have receiv'd an account from our Ambaflador at Adriahople, that he continued his Conferences with the Turkish Commissioners, who assured him, that the Ottoman Troops had received Orders not to com mit any Act of Hostility against Poland, till it was known whether the Republick did really defire to maintain King Augustus on the Throne, and that the Port would in a fhort time fend Commissioners to make an Erquiry to that purpose. We are fince inform'd, that the Ottoman Troops, to the number of Sixty or Seventy, thousand Men, are passed by Czerzorz, and are upon their March towards Cotchin; that the Han of Tartary had declared in favour of King Stanillaus, but that molt of the Officers had refus'd to follow him, and feveral of them were retired from the Army, and gone to Adrianople to complain to the Grand Signior, that the Han would make Way against Poland, witholit his Orders. Berlin, Sept. 2: N. S. The King has fent Mon-fieur Mardefeldt to the Court of Denmark, with a Commission in the behalf of the House of Holstein He is order'd to ftop at Hanover, to de-Gottorp. fire the Elector to join liis Intercession to that of his Majesty. Monsteur Krant is appointed to be Di-rector of the Manufactures, and it has been proposed to the Court to raile the Duties upon Foreign Goods to 25 per Cent. in order to improve the Value of those wrought here: Some Days ago a Courier arrived from Adrianople, but he was not admitted into the Town, having passed through the Emperor's Hereditary Countries, which are Infected with the Plague, and he delivered the Letters he had for this Court, and for the Swedifit Minifer, at the Gates of the Town, after which he purfued his way to Hamburg. We expect every Day, to hear that the Tienches are opened before Stetin, part of the Artillery defigned for that Siege being already arrived.

Hagur, Sept. 13. N. S. On the 11th Inflant the Duke d'Offuna and the Marquis de Monteleone, Plenipotentiaries of Spain, fet out from hence to wards Utrecht, in order to finish the Treaty of Peace between that Crown and Portugal. The faine Day the Earl of Strafford received an Express from Great Britain, and was afterwards in Conference with the Deputies of the States General and the Grand Penfionary, on the Subject of those Dif-patches. This Morning his Excellency and the Deputies of the States General had a Conference in the Chamber of Treves with Boron Heems the Em-peror's Minister, and with the feveral Ministers of the Empire reliding here.
