A40 Trunk Road (Highnam Gloucestershire) (Prohibition of U-Turns) (Experimental) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has made an experimental traffic regulation Order under section 9(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on part of the A40 trunk road known as Highnam Road in the Borough

of the A40 trunk road known as Highnam Road in the Borough of Tewkesbury in the County of Gloucestershire. The Order will come into force on 21st November 1988. It is anticipated that the Order will remain in force for 18 months, the maximum period authorised by section 9(3) of the Act.

The effect of the Order will be to prevent any person from causing or permitting any vehicle (other than an emergency services vehicle) from making a U-turn from the westbound carriageway of the trunk road between its junction with the western side of Newent Road (B415) and its junction with the castern side of Highnam Roundahout so as to proceed in the eastern side of Highnam Roundabout so as to proceed in the

opposite direction in the eastbound carriageway.

The Order is required to resolve a traffic problem which arises each weekday evening because of the large proportion of westbound traffic leaving Gloucester wishing to turn right onto the B4215. This causes long queues to develop on the off side lane of the A40 westbound carriageway. As a result of the delays which occur, many drivers are avoiding the queue of traffic by carrying out a U-turn at one of the two central reserve gaps situated just past the junction. Such U-turn manoeuvres are hazardous and concern has been expressed by both the police and the general public.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 14th November 1988, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the power conferred on him by Regulation 4 (1) (d) of the Importation of Milk Regulations 1988 (SI 1988 No. 1803) requires that any certificate accompanying imported cream or milk-based drinks (as defined in those Regulations) shall contain the information requested, and the official health attestation set out in the model certificate in the Schedule to this notice, shall be in English and shall be signed by an official of a competent authority in the exporting Member State (that is to say an authority having power under the laws in force in the exporting Member State to examine, cream and milk-based drinks and to certify as to their fitness for human consumption).
