The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

T having been represented to Her Majelty in Council, That the Lucretia Bark, Joleph Ambler, Master, Burthen about Twenty five Tons, laden with Two hundred and feventy two Barrels of Powder, bound from Plymouth to Her Majelty's Magazine below Greenwich, being on Saturday the 29th of August last at an Anchor in the Downs, about Six a-Clock in the Evening, there came on Board the faid Bark Seven Men in a Deal-Xawl, and after having Imprisoned the Master'and his Crew, Plunder'd her of about One hundred and fifty Barrels of the faid Powder, and put the fame on Board a Collier they had Seiz'd, and Sail'd away therewith, putting the Mafter and Men thereof on Board the faid Bark. Her Majefty for the Difcovery of the Perfons concerned in the faid Robbery, is gra-cioully pleafed to promife, that a Reward of I wo hundred Pounds shall be paid to the l erson or Per-fons who shall first discover the faid Robbers, or any one or more of them, so as he or they shall be apprehended and brought to Juilice for the fame. And Her Najefty is further pleafed to promife, That if any One of the Perfons concerned in the faid Robbery fhall make fuch Difcovery, he fhall not only have the faid Reward, but fhall likewife have Her Majesty's most gracious Pardon for the said Offence. And the Right Hon. the Lord High Trea-furer of Great Britain is hereby required to cause Payment to be made of the faid Reward of Two hundred Pounds to the Perfon or Perfons making fuch Discovery upon the Conviction of any one or more of the faid Robbers.

Her Majesty in Council was this Day graciously pleased to declare his Grace the Duke of Shrewsbu-

ry Lord Lieutenant of Ireland. This Day, by Her Majefty's Command, the Right Hon. John Earl of Mar was Sworn one of Her Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Warfaw, September 4. N. S. King Augustus has fixed on the 19th of this Month for his journey to Sendomir, where he is to review his Saxon Troops, and it is thought at the fame time he will hold a general Council of War. Monfieur Buzenval, the French Minister, arrived here from Dantsig a few Days ago, and has had an Audience of the King, but he has not yet taken any Character upon him, and it is not known how long he intends to ftay. They write from Stockholm, that the People of that City were in a great Confiernation upon a Report that the Army commanded by General Lubecker in Finland had been defeated by the Muscovites, and Sixty or Seventy of the Swedish Officers taken Prifoners. We have received Advice from Adria-nople, that the King of Sweden was fo ill of a Fever, that none of his Miniflers had been permitted to fee him for feveral Days before, and his Life was defpair'd of when those Letters came away.

Hamburgh, September 15. N. S. The Admini-firator of Holftein intending to go from hence to Brunfwick, has defired a Pafiport of the Elector of Hanover to go through his Dominons, which has been granted him, with this Reflriction, that his Retinue is to fet out eight Days before him, in order to perform a Quarentine. Monfieur Bassewitz, Envoy of Holftein at Berlin, has deminded that the Articles of the Treaty concluded with the Duke his Master may be performed, upon which he has had some warm Disputes with the Ministers of that Court, and it is judged from fome Incidents which have lately happened, that the King of Prussia will use no other means than his bare Re-quest in behalf of the Duke of Holstein. Count Flemming is gone from Berlin to Saxony, where he intends to flay but a little while, and then to fet our for Poland. He is very much discontented at the King of Denmark's recalling his Troops that were upon their March towards Pomerania, fince by that means, it's probable, the Siege of Stral-fund mult be deferred till the rext Campaign. Kipg Augustus has already fent away fome of his Domeflicks to Sendomir, and intends very foon to fet out himfelf towards the fame Place. The Admiralty of Sweden has fitted out Twenty Gallies, to carry a Reinforcement of Troops to General Lubecker in Finland. Monfieur Live, who was named by the Senate to Command them, has refused to go, un+

lefs he is declared General in Chief. Hague, Sept. 19. N. S. Monfieur de Chateau-neuf, Ambaifador Extraordinary from the Moft Christian King to the States General, arrived here Yesterday, The Marquis de Bourg, who has re-fided at this Place several Years as Minister of the Duke of Savoy, had this Moining an Audience of Leave of the States General. The Earl of Strafford went from hence a few Days ago to Utrecht, and is expected back very foon.

Uirecht, Sept. 20. N. S. Since the arrival of the Earl of Strafford from the Hague, the Ministers of Spain and Lorqugal have had frequent Conferences in the Prefence of those of Her Majesty, in order to adjust the remaining Difficulties in the Treaty of Peace between those two Crowns. To Morrow the Ministers of Great Britain and Spain are to begin their Conferences to fettle a Treaty of Commerce between the two Nations, which it is believ'd will be concluded in a few Days.
