HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

*The Bath-Lincoln Trunk Road
(Alcester Bypasses A435/A422 Side Roads) (No. 2)
Order 1988*

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that, in relation to the new trunk road to be constructed by him as a by-pass to the west and south of Alcester in the county of Warwickshire, he has made under section 14 of the Highways Act 1980 an Order, the effect of which is—

- (a) to authorise him—
- (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter a highway, and
 - (ii) to construct a new highway which will be a bridleway, on or in the vicinity of the route of the above mentioned new trunk road, and
- (b) provide for the transfer of the new highway to the County Council of Warwickshire as from the date on which he notifies the Council that it has been completed and is open for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Order and of the relevant plan have been deposited at the Department of Transport, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1, and at the offices of the Director (Transport) West Midlands Region, 5 Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL; and of the Warwickshire County Council, Shire Hall, Warwick; Stratford-on-Avon District Council, Elizabeth House, Church Street, Stratford-upon-Avon; Stratford-on-Avon District Council, Area Sub Office, Alcester; Alcester Public Library, Priory Road, Alcester and at the Post Office, High Street, Alcester where they are open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Copies of the Order, the title of which is "The Bath-Lincoln Trunk Road (Alcester Bypasses A435/A422 Side Roads) (No. 2) Order 1988", can be obtained from the Department of Transport, at the offices of the Director (Transport) West Midlands Region, 5 Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 11th January 1989, or within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, if such period shall expire later, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The Order as made embodies part of the proposals contained in the draft Side Roads Order published by the Secretary of State on 25th February 1988. A further Side Roads and Compulsory

Purchase Order is contemplated which, if made, will authorise the construction of a bridlebridge over the Alcester bypass in the vicinity of Primrose Lane.

THE ACQUISITION OF LAND ACT 1981

*The Bath-Lincoln Trunk Road
(Alcester Bypasses A435/A422) Compulsory Purchase Order
(Supplementary) (No. CM 72) 1988*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the above-mentioned Acts, on the 21st December 1988, made a compulsory purchase order, entitled as above.

The Order as made provides for the purchase of—

- (a) the land described in the schedule hereto for the purpose of—
- (i) the construction of a highway and the improvement of a highway in the Parish of Alcester in the District of Stratford-on-Avon in the county of Warwickshire in pursuance of the Bath-Lincoln Trunk Road (Alcester Bypasses A435/A422 Side Roads (No. 2) Order 1988,
 - (ii) use by the Secretary of State in connection with such construction and improvement of highways.

Copies of the Order as made by the Secretary of State and of the plan referred to therein, together with copies of the above-mentioned Side Roads Order (with their accompanying plans), have been deposited and may be seen at all reasonable hours from 11th January 1989 to 22nd February 1989 at the offices of the Department of Transport, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1, and at the offices of the Director (Transport) West Midlands Region, 5 Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL; and at Warwickshire County Council, Shire Hall, Warwick; Stratford-on-Avon District Council, Elizabeth House, Church Street, Stratford-upon-Avon; Stratford-on-Avon District Council, Area Sub Office, Alcester; Alcester Public Library, Priory Road, Alcester and at the Post Office, High Street, Alcester.

The Order as made becomes operative on the date on which this notice is first published: a person aggrieved by the Order may, by application to the High Court within 6 weeks from the operative date, question its validity on the grounds—

- (i) that the authorisation granted by the Order is not empowered to be granted, or
- (ii) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by failure to comply with any statutory requirement relating to the Order.
