

HEREFORD AND DISTRICT COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (40 m.p.h Speed Limit) (No.) Order 1989 (Imposition of 40 m.p.h Speed Limit) (C1261 Hereford to Hoarwithy Road, Little Dewchurch).

Notice is hereby given that Hereford and District County Council propose to make an Order under sections 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, the effect of which will be to impose a speed limit of 40 m.p.h on that length of the C1261 Hereford to Hoarwithy Road in the parish of Little Dewchurch in the district of South Herefordshire in the county of Hereford and Worcester, commencing from a point 610 metres (2,001 feet) north-west of its junction with the C1266 Little Dewchurch to Bolstone Road for a distance of 1,150 metres (3,773 feet) in a south-easterly direction to a point 540 metres (1,772 feet) south-east of that junction.

A copy of the draft Order, together with a map showing the length of road concerned and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined during normal office hours at South Herefordshire District Council Offices, Brockington, 35 Hafod Road, Hereford, and County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester.

HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (C2235 Doddenham to Berrow Green Road, Haynes Green) (Prohibition of Heavy Commercial Vehicles of over 7.5 tonnes) Order 1989.

Notice is hereby given that Hereford and Worcester County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(4) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers, the effect of which will be that no person shall cause or permit any heavy commercial vehicle to proceed in that length of the western route of C2235 Doddenham to Berrow Green Road in the Parishes of Doddenham and Martley in the District of Malvern Hills in the County of Hereford and Worcester which extends from its junction with the A44 in a northerly direction to its junction with the C2066.

Exemptions are contained in the Order for vehicles of the following classes or for the following purposes if the vehicle:

- (a) is being used for or in connection with the conveyance of persons, goods, merchandise, furniture or effects;
- (b) is being used in any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply and maintenance of any gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus;
- (c) is being used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
- (d) is being used for the purpose of agriculture in connection with land adjacent to the length of road or in the conveyance of timber felled upon that land;
- (e) is being used to gain access for the services of a garage;
- (f) is being used in connection with a circus, fair or similar event which has been authorised by the Council;
- (g) is being used for or in connection with the conveyance of goods for sale from that vehicle;
- (h) is being used to gain access to any land or premises where there is not a satisfactory alternative means of vehicular access;
- (i) is a mechanical road cleansing vehicle;
- (j) is being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

The alternative route for heavy commercial vehicles will be via the B4197 Ankerdine Hill Road.

HOUNSLOW LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL

The London Borough of Hounslow (Prescribed Routes) (No. 2) Traffic Order 1989

Bath Road (A4) Junction the Avenue, Cranford

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Hounslow, with the consent of the Secretary of State for Transport, on 6th February 1989 made the above-mentioned traffic Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by section 8 and Schedule 5 of the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit vehicles proceeding in Bath Road, Cranford making U-turns through the gap in the central reservation opposite The Avenue, Cranford.

3. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply:

- (a) in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
- (b) in respect of anything done in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

4. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 13th February 1989, can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made in the main reception at the Civic Centre, Lampton Road, Hounslow, Middlesex TW3 4DN.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order, or any provisions therein on the grounds that they are not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

HUMBERSIDE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Humberside (Boothferry Borough) (Various Roads, Snaith) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Revocation) Order 1989.

Notice is hereby given that the Humberside County Council propose to make a Road Traffic Regulation Order the effect of which will be:

- (a) To prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time in parts of the following roads:
A645 Shearburn Terrace, A1041 Beast Fair, A1041 Selby Road, George Street, Mill Street, Buttermarket and Market Place.
- (b) To prohibit vehicles from waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive in part of Market Place.
- (c) To revoke The County, of the West Riding of Yorkshire (Market Place, Snaith) (Prohibition) of Waiting) Order 1968.

Exemptions to the Order include permission to wait for the purpose of picking up and setting down passengers, at bus timing points, loading and unloading, the maintenance of roads, gas, water and electricity supplies and for fire, police and ambulance purposes.
