### NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO VARY A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Yorkshire Water Authority by Dales Water Services Ltd., Witherick Lane, Melmerby, Ripon, North Yorkshire HG4 5JB on behalf of Suncharm Ltd., P.O. Box No. 6, Queens Square, Huddersfield Road, Honley HD7 2QZ to vary licence (serial number 2/27/10/67) to abstract water from a borehole in the millstone grit at N.G.R. SE 141126, Queens Square, Honley, Kirklees District, West Yorkshire.

The Variation applied for is:

- to increase the hourly rate to 3,500 gallons.
- to increase the daily rate to 84,000 gallons.
- to increase the yearly rate to 30,000,000 gallons.

The increased quantity is required due to an expansion in production capacity.

## ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

### NORTH BEDFORDSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL

North Bedfordshire Borough Council (Link Road—Linden Road and Dynevor Road, Bedford) (One Way Traffic) Order 1989

Notice is hereby given that on 9th February 1989 the North Bedfordshire Borough Council acting as Agents for the Bedfordshire County Council as highway authority made an order under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic

Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit vehicles from proceeding except in an easterly direction in the link road between Linden Road and Dynevor Road, Bedford.

A copy of the order, which will come into effect on 13th February 1989, and a map showing the length of road in question may be examined at the address below during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the order, you may within 6 weeks from 9th February 1989, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

### NORTH BEDFORDSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL

Borough of Bedford (Off Street Parking Places) Order 1969

North Bedfordshire Borough Council (Melbourne Street, Bedford)  
(off Street Parking Places) Order 1987, Amendment No. 1/89

Notice is hereby given that the North Bedfordshire Borough Council in exercise of their powers under section 35 (1) and (3) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 propose to make Orders the effect of which will be to:

1. Revise the charges for parking in the Council's multi-storey and surface car parks as set out in the Schedule to this notice.
2. Amend the present Order so that the daytime tariff in force in the Allhallows Multi-Storey Car Park on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays shall terminate at 6.30 p.m. (and not 8.30 p.m. as at present).
3. To allow free daytime parking between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. in the Melbourne Street Car Park for the duration of the planned 'Park and Ride' experimental scheme.
