By the QUEEN, A PROCLAMATION, For Proroguing the Parliament.

ANNE R. Hereas We have caused Our Writs to be Issued VV for the Calling of a Parliament, to Meet and be Holden at Wellminster on Thursday the Twelfth Day of November next following, We, by the Advice of our Privy-Council, do bereby Publish and Declare, That the said Parliament shall be Prorogued, on the faid Twelfth Day of November, to Thursday the Tenth Day of December next ensuing. And We bave given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Writ-Patent under Our Great Seal for Proroguing the same accordingly. And We do here-by further Declare, That convenient Notice shall be given by Proclamation of the Time when the said Parliament shall be Holden, and Sit for the Dispatch of Business, to the end that the Members of both Houses may order their Affairs accordingly.

Given at our Court at Windsor, the Eighteenth Day of October, 1713. In the Twelfth Year of Our Reign.

For Putting in Execution the Laws and Statutes of ling-Clay.

Hereas many good Laws bave been made to Probibit and Prevent the Exportation of Wooll, Wooll-Fells, Mortlings or Shorlings, or any Tarn made of Wooll, or any Wooll-Flocks, or any Fuller's Earth, or Fulling-Clay what seever, out of the King doms of Great Britain or Ireland, or out of the Isles of Jexsey or Guernsey, with Sark and Alderney, into Foreign Parts, out of the Kingdoms or Isles aforesaid, under the several Penalties and Forfeitures in the faid Laws contained; In and by which Laws several Encouragements are given to such Person or Persons who shall Sue or Inform for the same: And thereby several Directions are given, as well for Guards on the Coasts, as for Entring and Registring of Wooll, near the Sea-Coasts, for the better Preventing such Exportation, under several Penalties therein mentioned s yet nevertheless the Exportation thereof is still notoriously Continued, to the great Discouragement and Prejudice of the Woollen Trade and Manufacture of this Kingdom: We therefore, taking the same into Our serious Confideration, and duly weighing the Evil Consequences thereof to the Woollen Manufasture of this Kingdom, by and with the Advice of Our Privy-Council, have thought fit to Mue thu Our Royal Proclama-tion: And We do hereby, in pursuance of the said Laws, firitly Charge, Probibit, and Command, That po manner of Woolf, Woolf-Fells, Woolfen-Tarns Mort.

And We do hereby strictly Charge and Command all Our Officers of the Customs, and others, who shall be any ways Imployed or Intrasted in the Discovering, Prosecuting, or Preventing the said Offences, that they do use their utmost Diligence in the Discharge of their said Trust, under the Pain of Incurring Our highest Displeasure. And We do bereby strictly Charge and Command all Our Officers and Ministers to be Aiding and Assisting to the Officers of Our Customs, and others duly Author rized to put in Execution the said Laws, and all others Asting in their Aid. And for the surther Encouragement of all Persons to be diligent to Discover any of the Exporters of Woodl, contrary to the said Laws, We do bereby Promise and Declare, That who soever shall Discover any Person or Persons who, since the First Day of July last past, bath or have Exported, or before the First Day of July now this Realm, for the Preventing the Exportation next enfuing, shall Export any Wooll contrary to the of Wooll, Wooll-Fells, Woollen-Yarn, Mortlings, faid Laws, so as such Person or Persons be brought Shorlings, Wooll-Flocks, Fuller's Earth, and Fuller, shall have and receive, over and above all next ensuing, shall Export any Wooll contrary to the Rewards already given by Alts of Parliament, the further Reward of Forty Pounds, whereof Our High Treasurer is hereby Ordered to make Payment. And if any such Offender shall make such Discovery of any other of the said Offenders, so we he or they be brought to Justice, such Discoverer shall not only have Our Gracious Pardon for his said Offence, but shall have and receive the Remard hereby promised, as afore-

Vienna, October 11. N. S. His Imperial Majesty holds frequent Councils upon the present Posture of his Affairs. The Convent of Dominicans has been order'd to be shut up, upon an Information that the Friar's had carried out the Bodies of sour or five of their Order, who died of the Contagious Distemper, and had buried them at a Place within a League of this City. The Mortality here is not near to great as it has been, but in other Parts of the Empire the Contagion spreads, and we are in-formed that not long ago Five hundred and thirt teen Persons died in three Days at Prague, in Bo-The Marquis de Rofrano, Post-Master General of the Kingdom of Naples, is gone from hence, in order to take Possession of a Principality the Em-



bassador of King Augustus, was assured by the Turkish Ministers, that the Grand Signior would acknowledge his Master for lawful King of Poland, upon Condition that his Majesty would grant a general Pardon to King Stanislaus, and all those who had follow'd his Party. This was promis'd by the Ambassador; upon which, Orders were sent to the Seraskier, who commands the Army on the Frontiers, as also to the Han of Tartary, not to commit any act of Hostility against Muscovy or Poland, the Grand Signior being resolved to observe every It was faid ticle of the Treaty of Carlowitz. the King of Sweden intended very foon to embark for Marseilles, in order to return from thence into his own Dominions.

Hamburgh, October 24. N. S. The number of those that died here last Week amounts to Six hundred and eighteen. The Elector of Hanover has forbid all Communication between his Dominions and this City, fince our Magistrates have refused to receive some Troops his Electoral Highness would have placed at Billwerder and Vierlande. It is said the King of Denmark has taken into his Pay Eight thousand Muscovites, that were to have returned home from Pomerania, and that he intends to employ them as long as the War continues. The Governor of Wismar makes some Difficulty of admitting a Prussan Garrison into that Place, but Monfieur Meyerfeldt has undertaken to perswade him to it, in order to which he is gone thither to acquaint him with the Motives that prevail'd on him to fur-render Stetin. Prince Menzikoff intended to fet out on the 19th for Petersbourg, in order to give the Czar an Account of his Negotiations in Pomerania, and Monsieur Bassewitz was to accompany him, to defire his Majesty's Favour in behalf of the House of Holstein. The Swedish Fleet went into Bornholm, as foon as that of Denmark app ar'd at Sea, and the latter continues still on the C asts of Pomerania, to hinder the Transportation of their Enemy's Garrisons. We have receiv'd Advice from Warsaw, that the Turkish Ministers arrived there on the 12th, and were to be admitted to an Audience on the 18th. Count Tarlo, a near Relation of King Stanislaus, came with them, in order to make some Agreement between King Augustus and that Prince, who desires only to be restored to his Estate: And upon that Condition, it is faid, he will consent to Renounce his Pre enflors to the Crown of Poland, and live in some other Country.

Hague, October 28. N. S. On the 26th the Earl of Strafford was in Conference with the Deputies of the States-General, upon the Affairs of the Ne-therlands. Her Majesty's Yatch, the Peregrine, being arrived at Rotterdam, his Excellency intends within two Days to fet out for Great Britain. Duke d'Ossuna, Ambassador of Spain, is come hither from Utrecht.

Chefter, Ollober 20. Yesterday in the Afternoon the Duke of Shrewsbury, Lord Chamberlain of Her Majesty's Houshold, and Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, arrived here in his way to that Kingdom. He was faluted at his entrance into the Town, by a discharge of the Cannon of the Castle. At the Gate he was met by the Mayor and Aldermen in their Formalities, and the Recorder made a Speech to Compliment him in the Name of the City. After which he went to the Town-house, where an Entertainment was prepared for him, and this Morning his Grace proceeded on his Journey to Holyhead, where he intends to embark for Ireland.
