Encombe Stabilisation Scheme, Sandgate, Folkestone

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to section 5(1) of the Coast Protection Act 1949 that Shepway District Council, acting in its capacity as Coast Protection Authority, intends to carry out coast protection works in the vicinity of Encombe Sandgate, Folkestone, Kent.

The works in question involve the stabilisation of the Encombe landslip by way of the installation of a total of 166 re-inforced concrete dowel piles to the south of the A259 Sandgate Esplanade and to the rear of Nos. 119-161 Sandgate High Street.

The total estimated cost of the works, including fees and salaries, amounts to £1,436,800.

ASHFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Ashford Borough (Various Roads, Ashford) (Restriction of Waiting) (Variation) Order No. 1 1989

Notice is hereby given that the Ashford Borough Council, as agents for Kent County Council, have been made the above Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on 9th March 1989, the general effects of which will be to:

- (i) vary the existing waiting restrictions in certain streets generally lying to the north and north-west of the Ashford Ring Road, to enable residents living in those streets to gain an advantage in parking near their homes by granting them an exemption from the proposed peak-hour waiting restrictions;
- (ii) impose additional waiting restrictions, 24-hour working day and peak hour, in the Victoria Road/Victoria Crescent/George Street enclave;
- (iii) impose additional working day and 24-hour waiting restrictions in Quantock Drive, Magazine Road, Canterbury Road, Queens Road, Wall Road, Albert Road, Barrow Hill, Barrow Hill Terrace, Gravel Walk, Brooke Road, Norwood Gardens and Church Road;
- (iv) make an administration charge of 5 pounds (as one-off payment) for the issue of a permit for the residents restriction exemption;
- (v) to make various conditions on the proper use of the residents parking arrangements.

The roads or lengths of road in which the residents parking arrangements would apply are Albert Road, Hardinge Road, Hollington Place, Kent Avenue, Queens Road, Park Road North, Quantock Drive, Sturges Road, Sussex Avenue, Wall Road, Welleley Road and East Street.

The Order will come into operation on 20th March 1989, and a copy of the Order, a copy of the relevant map and the statement of reasons for making the Order may be examined at the offices of the
