TREASURY

VALUE ADDED TAX

Treasury Direction dated 6th March 1989 under section 27(2A) of the Value Added Tax Act 1983 as to the refund to Government Departments of tax charged on the supply of goods and services or on the importation of goods received by them otherwise than for the purpose of carrying on activities in the course or furtherance of a business.

The Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 27(2A) of the Value Added Tax Act 1983 (1983 c.55), inserted by section 11 of the Finance Act 1984 (1984 c.43), hereby direct as follows:

- (1) This direction shall come into operation on 1st April 1989.
- (2) A government department listed or belonging to a category of departments listed in column (1) of any of the Schedules to this direction may claim and be paid a refund of the tax charged on the supply of services of the nature listed in relation to that department or category of departments in column (2) of those Schedules, or on the supply or importation of goods incidental to the supply of those services, if and only if,
 - (a) the supply of those services is not for the purpose of any business carried on by the department; or
 - (b) the supply of those services is not for the purpose of any supply by the department which, by virtue of directions made under section 27(2) and (3) of the Value Added Tax Act 1983, is treated as a supply in the course or furtherance of a business; and
 - (c) the charge of the tax would raise the price of obtaining those services from outside the department above the cost to the department of providing them itself; and
 - (d) the department complies with the requirements of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise both as to the time, form and manner of the claim and also on the keeping, presentation and production of records relating to the supply or importation in question.
- (3) The Treasury directions dated 7th November 1984, 28th March 1985, 18th March 1986, 24th March 1987 and 7th March 1988, made under Section 27(2A) of the Value Added Tax Act 1983, are hereby revoked.

**RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS BY THE PUBLIC

NOTICE

TREASURY MINUTE dated 4th April 1989.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury read section 3(2) of the National Loans Act 1968 (1968 C.13 as amended) whereby any sums borrowed from the Public Works Loan Commissioners shall bear interest at such rates as the Treasury may determine from time to time in accordance with section 5 of the said Act.

My Lords understand that the Public Works Loan Commissioners will be operating arrangements under which local authorities are permitted to borrow from the Commissioners up to a specified quota at a certain fixed rate of interest and in excess of such quota at one of two higher fixed rates.

In accordance therewith the Chancellor of the Exchequer now recommends that with effect from 5th April 1989 and until the coming into operation of a further determination:

- (i) The rate of interest applicable to any such fixed rate loan will be that in force on the day the authority applies to borrow or, if the application is before noon three working days before the loan is credited to the account of the authority's banker, the rate in force at 11 a.m. two banking days before credit day;

Conservation Areas at Ampney St. Mary, Avening, Brimpsfield, Calcot, Caudle Green, Cherington, Church Westcote, Coln Rogers, Coln St. Dennis, Cutsdean, Daylesford, Dowdeswell, Ford, Hazleton, Nether Westcote, Temple Guiting, Westonbirt, Whittington, Wyck Rissington, Yanworth.

Notice is hereby given that Cotswold District Council has designated areas in the above mentioned settlements in the county of Gloucester as Conservation Areas, pursuant to section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971. Maps of the designated areas have been deposited at the offices of the Cotswold District Council at Trinity Road, Cirencester and Oxford Street, Moreton in Marsh, and may be inspected during normal office hours. The areas comprise the following places.

1. *Ampney St. Mary.* Most of this settlement is designated, the exceptions being modern agricultural structures at Wisse Farm, College Farm and Forty Farm. The pond and woodland at the western end of the village are both within the Conservation Area, but the separate cluster of buildings at Hill Oak is excluded.

2. *Avening.* This designation comprises two separate areas, the larger part centred around Holy Cross Church, the other around the bottom of Hampton Hill. The excluded parts of the village are the modern housing estates at Sun Ground; Rectory Lane; Laurence Road; and Sandford Lease. The middle sections of the High Street and Point Road, together with the majority of Tetbury Hill and the whole of West End, also fall outside the designated area.

3. *Brimpsfield.* This Conservation Area incorporates most of the village, but excludes some modern development at the southern end, together with buildings to the north of Priory Cottage. The

designation includes St. Michael's Church; substantial earthworks (a Scheduled Ancient Monument) and an adjoining field to the east; and an open area opposite Brimpsfield House.

4. *Calcot.* The entire hamlet of Calcot (in the parish of Coln St. Dennis) is designated, with the exception of a modern barn on the north eastern side.

5. *Caudle Green.* This settlement located near Brimpsfield, is made up of two parts. While virtually all of the larger part is included in the Conservation Area, none of the small group of buildings in the valley bottom is designated.

6. *Cherington.* The only parts of the village not designated are Long Drive House, the cricket ground and some modern agricultural structures at Cox's Farm. A number of open areas within the Conservation Area include land at the rear of Old School House and fields opposite The Rectory.

7. *Church Westcote.* The designation covers all of the older parts of the village, The excluded areas are the council housing at Burton's Bank; dwellings to the east of the cemetery; Meadhurst and The Bungalow.

8. *Coln Rogers.* With the exception of the Coln Valley Village Hall, the entire settlement falls within the conservation Area, including a substantial area of woodland to the east of Pigeon House. Most of the river Coln floodplain, between this wood and the village, also forms part of the designation.

9. *Coln St. Denis.* The only parts of Coln St. Dennis excluded from the Conservation Area are land at The Ridges, South Hill and an orchard in the south eastern corner of the village.

10. *Cutsdean.* The whole of the village is designated apart from council houses at Town Close. Several large fields, which slope steeply down from the western edge of Cutsdean to the river Windrush are included in the Conservation Area.

11. *Daylesford.* The entire confines of this compact settlement (in the parish of Adlestrop) is designated.

12. *Dowdeswell.* This is a large designation which embraces the majority of Lower and Upper Dowdeswell, together with intervening landscaped parkland. The principal exclusions are Hillside Cottages; property to the west of the Old school; fields to the south of Haylens Farm; and landscaped parkland within OS field 0051.

13. *Ford.* Most of this hamlet (to the north of Temple Guiting) is designated, including the Windrush valley along the southern side. Ford Manor and Windrush House are not within the Conservation Area.

14. *Hazleton.* The designation includes the historic elements within the two built up areas, together with the intervening valley and extensive grounds south east of Hazleton House. The main exclusions are; the bungalows north of St. Andrew's Church; Plum Tree House; Rowans/Penny Farthing and adjoining OS fields 7800/7993; and a large modern barn to the west of Priory Farm.

15. *Nether Westcote.* The historic core of this settlement is designated, including the field south east of Walnut Tree House. The caravan site behind the New Inn; Hill View; Halloween; Broadmere; and the ribbon development to the west of Well House are all excluded from the Conservation Area.

16. *Temple Guiting.* The majority of Temple Guiting is designated, including New Barn Farm; fields to the south of St Mary's Church and west of Manor Farm; and woodland to the south-east of Temple Guiting House. Peripheral development is excluded in the vicinity of Colmans; The Sherry; and to the east of Manor Farm Cottage. The Conservation Area includes the avenue of trees on the north eastern approach to the village, but excludes most of the development along this road as far as Wells Head Lane.

17. *Westonbirt.* This is a very extensive designation, which includes large areas of landscaped parkland around Westonbirt School. However, none of the golf course falls within the Conservation Area. Broadly, the designation is triangular in shape, bounded on two sides by the A433 (between the Hare and Hounds Hotel and Morley Cottage) and the Easton Gray Road (between the Hare and Hounds and Pickards Lodge). The southern boundary runs to the south of the village and the school. Beyond this, the Conservation Area includes the Hare and Hounds Hotel; a number of properties around the Garden House; land between Woodlands Cottages and Pike House; Morley Cottage/Keepers Cottage; and the part of OS fields 0044 which slopes down to the village street.

18. *Whittington.* This comparatively extensive Conservation Area covers the historic core of the village, including Whittington Court and The Old Rectory. Other parts of the designation include the fields to the north and east to Whittington Court, and the woodland which forms an important feature behind the village, the main exclusions are Whittington Lodge Farm; The Glebe; and properties to the east of No. 26.

19. *Wyck Rissington*. The linear green, which runs through most of the village forms the basis of the Conservation Area. Most of the old buildings in the village are also included, the main exceptions being a group of dwellings at the northern end of the green; a cluster of former farm buildings behind the village hall; OS field 8760; the modern agricultural structures at Porters Farm; and Porters Cottage.

20. *Yanworth*. The whole of the village is designated, apart from modern farm structures at Yanworth Farm and garages to the rear of the village hall.

The purpose of designation is to preserve and enhance the character or appearance of these areas of special architectural and historic interest, and to ensure that special regard is paid to the architectural and visual qualities of the designated areas when proposals for development are under consideration. Subject to certain exceptions, 6 weeks prior notice has to be given to the Local Planning Authority in respect of a proposal to cut down, lop, top, uproot or cause wilful damage to any tree in the Conservation Area and Listed Building Consent is required for the demolition of buildings or walls, whether Listed or not, within the designated area. Failure to give such notice or obtain such consent may constitute a criminal offence.
