Exceptions to the prohibitions of waiting will be included in respect of disabled persons vehicles and to permit picking up and setting down of passengers, loading and unloading of goods, road works and the maintenance of essential services.

Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation on 1st June 1989, and maps showing the roads affected, may be examined at the Enquiry Office, Town Hall, Brighton, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Orders or of any provisions contained in them on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, you may, within 6 weeks from 25th May 1989, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
