## HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

*East of Abercynon—East of Dowlais Trunk Road (A4060) (Phase 2—Improvement between Pentrebach and Mountain Hare and Slip Roads) Order 19.*

*East of Abercynon—East of Dowlais Trunk Road (A4060) (Phase 2—Improvement between Pentrebach and Mountain Hare and Slip Roads, Side Roads) Order 19.*

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. An Order under sections 10 and 329 of the Highways Act 1980, as extended by section 18 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which will provide that roads which he proposes to construct along the following routes shall become a trunk road as from the date when this Order comes into force:

- (i) 3 sections of road (comprising the new trunk road) about 2.30 km. (about 1.43 miles) in total length between Pentrebach and Mountain Hare in the County of Mid Glamorgan;
- (ii) 2 slip roads to connect the new trunk road and the existing trunk road with a proposed new unclassified road at Glynmill;
- (iii) a roundabout, to connect the new trunk road with the existing trunk road, Goat Mill Road and a proposed new unclassified road, at Mountain Hare;

and that both the new trunk road and part of the existing trunk road will become the carriageways of a dual carriageway trunk road between Pentrebach and Mountain Hare. According vehicles will be prohibited from proceeding in any direction other than north to south on the southbound carriageways which will comprise part of the new trunk road and part of the existing trunk road, and south to north on the northbound carriageways which will comprise part of the existing trunk road and part of the new trunk road, all between Pentrebach and Mountain Hare, in the County of Mid Glamorgan.

2. An Order under sections 12, 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980:

(a) authorising him:

- (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- (ii) to stop-up highways;
- (iii) to construct new highways;
- (iv) to stop-up private means of access to premises; and
- (v) to provide new private means of access to premises;

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the new trunk road mentioned above; and

(b) providing for the transfer of each new highway to the County Council of Mid Glamorgan as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

Copies of the above-named draft Orders and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours from 10th August 1989 to 28th September 1989 or within 7 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, whichever period shall expire later at:

- (i) Mid Glamorgan County Council, County Hall, Cathays Park, Cardiff,
- (ii) Merthyr Tydfil Borough Council, Town Hall, Merthyr Tydfil,
- (iii) Pentrebach Sub-Post Office, New Stores, Pentrebach, Merthyr Tydfil.
- (iv) Dowlais Library, Church Street, Dowlais, and at
- (v) Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division, Phase 1, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff.

Any person may not later than 28th September 1989 or within 7 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, if such period shall expire later, object to the making of the Orders, by notice in writing to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division, Phase 1, Government Buildings,

## NEW TOWNS ACT 1981

*The New Town of Milton Keynes: Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way over part of Walton Road—Caldecotte (Walton 'A' Housing).*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over the following route shown coloured red on the map referred to therein:

That part of the eastern side of Walton Road at Walton Park, Caldecotte, starting from a point marked A on the map (approximately 110 metres south of Wadesmill Lane) and running in a generally southerly direction for a distance of approximately 45 metres to a point marked B on the map (located approximately 40 metres north of the bridge carrying City Road H10—Bletcham Way across Walton Road).
