(iii) in connection with and on the occasion of a wedding or funeral service held or to be held in St. Mary Aldermary Church.

Provision of Additional On-street Parking Facilities in Moorhouse Road

(b) provide that the vehicles which may be left in the residents' parking places shall be those displaying a valid parking card bearing the letter "B", issued by the City Council in respect of that vehicle. The charge for the use of these residents' parking places would be 50 pence per day, unless a valid season ticket is displayed. Season tickets cost £15 for 3 months or £55 for 12 months;

(c) provide that the vehicles which may be left in the disabled persons' parking place shall be those displaying either a valid permit issued by the Westminster City Council (commonly known as a "White Westminster Exemption Badge") or a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority (commonly referred to as the "orange badge") and that they may be left there without charge;

(d) provide that in respect of the metered parking place the rate of charge for its use would be 20 pence for 40 minutes (maximum initial period 2 hours), the excess charge (payable to the Westminster City Council) would be £6, the excess period would be one hour, the unexpired time on a meter may be used free of charge, the period during which a vehicle may not return to a metered parking place would be one hour and the vehicles which may be left in that parking place shall be passenger vehicles (12 seats or less), certain goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles and invalid carriages;

(e) provide that the parking places would operate between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays and between 8.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m., on Saturdays (Christmas Day, Good

Friday and Bank Holidays excepted);
